

The Ledger of Lott Woodworth (Major)

Son of William 4 and Mary (Caleb 3, Benjamin 2, Walter 1)
Born Cambridge, Washington Co., NY, 24 May 1766 and died Cambridge
21 August 1840. Served in War of 1812 as a Major, Battle of Plattsburg in 1819

The ledger records his woolen manufacturing and general merchandise in Cambridge, NY.
The first entry is in 1815.

The ledger is very faded and in some places very hard to impossible to read. Each page
can be enlarged in Adobe Acrobat Reader for significantly greater detail.
