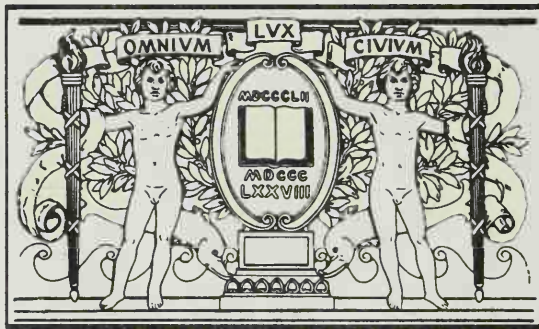

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PREFACE

This book is an attempt to document the Woodworth Family of America to date, taking into consideration all past efforts by many earlier family genealogists and present-day family members who have devoted enumerable hours adding to the Woodworth history. No one individual can be credited for all of the history of the Woodworth Family given in the pages that follow. Thankfully, there were genealogists down through the years who had the interest, the foresight, and the passionate desire to record the many Woodworth generations from the time of Walter Woodworth.

As with any genealogy where so many vital statistics are used and where much of the data comes from family sources themselves, errors will occur. Some errors are evident in the earlier Woodworth publications. These I have tried to address in this volume. Other discrepancies, no doubt, are still to be uncovered. However, let us not condemn the original authors nor the present ones. They have all tried to present, as correctly as possible within their own limits, the material available to them at the time.

Higher standards of accuracy in genealogy today through research, interpretation and computerization are evident; however, no matter how much care is given in compiling genealogical material, some errors will later be found, based on new evidence. This is expected.

I would like to encourage readers to join with me toward enhancing the true Woodworth genealogy in a changing world of more sophisticated genealogical standards. This volume is a base from which to start. I expect and accept criticism and would be delighted to receive documented information from readers to support any changes they might suggest.

It is hoped through circulation of this book, even more material will come to light to further enhance this genealogy; especially in finding the wife, parents and English heritage of Walter Woodworth of 1630.

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Compiling Woodworth material began around 1874 with William Atwater 7 Woodworth, son of Walter 6 and Mary (Nathan 5, Elijah 4, David 3, Isaac 2, Walter 1). He was an attorney at White Plains, New York. His first and only book was published in 1898 on the Woodworth family. He continued to collect Woodworth records until his death.

Ernest Edward Woodworth apparently began compiling his Woodworth material around 1898, about the time William Atwater Woodworth published his works. Ernest died in 1940.

In the meantime, Jay Backus 8 Woodworth, son of Allen 7 and Amanda (Israel 6, Oliver 5, William 4, Daniel 3, Isaac 2, Walter 1) started his outstanding collection as early as 1910 and continued until his death in 1929.

Philip Bell 9 Woodworth, son of Thomas 8 and Mary (Stephen 7, Caleb 6,5, Gershom 4, Caleb 3, Benjamin 2, Walter 1), a Chicago lawyer, started compiling Woodworth data early in the 20th century. He worked closely with Jay Backus and Ernest Edward. The three were on the verge of publishing a genealogy, but it never materialized. Philip Bell died in 1937.

Nothing further transpired until 1941 when James R. Pierce of Pasadena, Calif., became interested in his own Woodworth line descending on the maternal side from the Reverend Timothy 6 Woodworth, son of William 5 and Sarah (Jedediah 4, Joseph 3,2, Walter 1), and in trying to solve it, he started collecting data in 1941 and 1942 to develop his own Woodworth collection. He learned that Jay Backus Woodworth's collection was stored in the vaults of the New England Historical Society in Boston. James Pierce managed to work on it for several days there in 1945/6. He tried in vain to obtain Ernest Edward Woodworth's collection. In 1957, he contacted Horace Jay Woodworth, son of Ernest, who had the manuscript. An agreement was reached to purchase the manuscript at that time.

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If James Pierce had had access to Ernest Edward Woodworth's material, hundreds of hours of work might have been saved due to the duplication of efforts. James Pierce worked to correct some of the errors made in the basic genealogical scheme of the family, and he catalogued the family.

James Pierce conducted a search in England and felt that Walter Woodworth may have been a brother to, or closely related to, Henry Woodworth, born Much-Woolton Township in the parish of Childwell in the hundred of West Derby in Lancashire 22 May 1607, son of Thomas and Elizabeth (Tysen) Woodworth/Woodward of Dorchester and Northampton, Mass. He believed that Walter was a Woodworth and not a Woodward. None of this has been substantiated, and his material has yet to be found as he died without heirs and there has been no reply to letters to his estate.

Pearl 9 Woodworth Carlton, daughter of Edwin 8 and Helen (Charles 7, Joseph 6, Abner 5, Joseph 4,3,2, Walter 1), during her lifetime researched libraries and elsewhere in both the United States and England. After her death her material was made available to Harry Rice (her cousin's son). Harry L. Rice was born in 1847, son of Mary Charlotte (Woodworth) Rice and grandson of Charles Granderson 9 Woodworth (James 8, Charles 7, Joseph 6, Abner 5, Joseph 4,3,2, Walter 1). He and his wife traveled extensively in the U.S. trying to track down Woodworth descendants. Harry Rice's wife, Anne, published his typescript of the descendants of Walter and his two elder sons, Thomas and Joseph, after Harry died. He also worked on all the lines in conjunction with Maurice Woodworth of Tulsa, Oklahoma.

Maurice E. 9 Woodworth, son of Charles 8 and Carrie (William 7, Samuel 6, Abner 5, Joseph 4,3,2, Walter 1), became involved while also trying to gain possession of Ernest Edward Woodworth's collection, but was finally referred to James

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Pierce. James Pierce supplied Maurice with copies of his manuscript and all the references he had compiled up to that time. Maurice then began his effort working backwards from the present day Woodworths to connect with the records already documented. Maurice's persistence helped to get complete data of family lines from around 1941 until his death in 1979. Many helped Maurice's efforts including Hassie Lane of Temple, Texas.

In 1963, I, Jeanette Woodworth Behan, daughter of William Chauncey 8 and Jennette (William 8, Augustus 7, Spencer 6, Joshue 5, Eliphalt 4, Ebenezer 3, Benjamin 2, Walter 1) came in contact with Maurice E. Woodworth while trying to become a member of the DAR. Maurice suggested that in order to avoid duplication of efforts that we work together, as the Woodworth documentation had become nearly too vast for one person to handle. I assisted in typing and in contacting "living" Woodworths. This mutually-satisfying correspondence with Maurice continued until his passing. For a few years afterwards, it was difficult to continue working on the Woodworth family as I felt quite inadequate without the support of the person who so kindly guided me for so many years.

Then along came Julian Woodworth of North Adams, Mass., (a descendant of Leonard 6 Woodworth and Elizabeth, William 5, Jedediah 4, Joseph 3, 2, Walter 1). He was searching for his roots in New Brunswick, Canada, which opened up a whole new world of Woodworths for me. Through contacts in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, many additional family members were added to the Woodworth Genealogy.

In latter years G. Alan Royce of Erdenheim, Penn., (a descendant of Gershom Evarts 5 Woodworth Gershom 4, Caleb 3, Benjamin 2, Walter 1) was kind enough to send me Woodworth excerpts from genealogical books and generously gave many valuable opinions on various problems. These references

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have been invaluable and most of what is listed in the Bibliography is a direct result of G. Alan Royce's research efforts.

Barbara Cruchon (a descendant of Ebenezer 4,3, Benjamin 2, Walter 1), of Seattle, Wash., is credited with supplying much of the background material on Walter Woodworth and his four sons. She is perhaps the most accurate researcher the Woodworth family can boast of to-date. Her research has corrected and/or verified past existing material.

Victor Montes (a descendant of James 8,7, Dudley 6, Amasa 5, Jesse 4, Stephen 3, Isaac 2, Walter 1) has also given of his time willingly to assist myself and others in need of Woodworth material.

In 1984, The Woodworth Family Newsletter edited by myself was published and was circulated to over 200 Woodworth family members throughout the United States and Canada. This was a most enjoyable endeavor and enabled me to reach out and touch many "relatives." It was with great regret I had to end the newsletter.

Help came from many sources. I have only touched the surface in acknowledging all those who have contributed to this genealogy and I apologize if I have inadvertently overlooked someone. Family members who have helped exclusively on their own lines are too numerable to list here, but my heartfelt thanks are extended to them for their own personal contributions.

1. WALTER 1 WOODWORTH, the progenitor of the Woodworth Family in America, was born in England about 1612 and died Scituate, Plymouth Colony, early in 1686; parentage unknown.

He married about 1639/40. No record has been found of his wife's name. She was living in March 1676 when a court case mentions Mehitable Woodworth's parents, but had died by 26 November 1685, when Walter made his Will, naming ten children.

Some have speculated that Walter married Elizabeth Rogers, the daughter of Thomas Rogers of the "Mayflower." Elizabeth Daniel, authoress of Thomas Rogers, Pilgrim and Some of His Descendants, 1980, states, "Whether Thomas Rogers really had a daughter Elizabeth at all is a matter of theory. There are records in Leyden, Holland, that suggest that two daughters lived there with their mother, but there is no absolute proof. Whether one or both of these possible daughters ever came to America, we don't know...."

Walter may have indentured himself for a time in order to pay his passage expenses, as the records do mention Walter as having "come as a servant" to Plymouth Colony. Plymouth Court Records of 2 Jan. 1633/4 order "that whereas by indenture many are bound to give their servants land at the expiration of their terms, it is ordered that they have it at Scituate or some other convenient place, where it may be useful."

There is no record of his presence on any of the many ships which sailed from England to the Colonies in the 17th century. Many early Scituate settlers were from County Kent in England, and it has been thought that Walter may have come from there as well, perhaps as one of Rev. John Lothrop's followers from Edgerton in Kent. Rev. Lothrop, first pastor of the church in Scituate, arrived in Boston, Sept. 1634 on the "Griffin," with some 30 members of his congregation, both from London and Kent. This was six months after

Walter is first recorded in Plymouth Colony. Walter does not appear to have been a member of Rev. Lothrop's Church.

One story has Walter Woodworth arriving as a passenger at Nantasket, 30 May 1630 aboard the "Mary and John." A list of probable passengers has been reconstructed from contemporary evidence. None include any Woodworth/Woodward/Woodart.

Walter first appears in the records on a list of taxpayers in Plymouth Colony, made between 2 Jan. 1633/4 when the tax "for publick use" was ordered, and 27 March 1634, when the list was presented to the Court. Walter's name falls near the end of the list, and he is taxed at nine shillings. It is assumed he was still a single man without house or property, but not now a servant.

Another persistent story is that Walter arrived in Mass. with two brothers. They evidently returned to England, married there, and then came back to Scituate. A number of other Woodward/Woodworth immigrants do appear in the Mass. Bay Colony; it is possible they may have been inter-related in some way. Since there is no clear record of Walter in Plymouth Colony between April 1635 and Dec. 1640, he perhaps returned to England during this interval, if it occurred at all.

In 1634, Walter acquired the first of his considerable land holdings, a house lot in Scituate which was the third lot on Kent Street, with an ocean frontage, at the corner of Meeting House Lane; a tract on the First Herring Brook, which was not far below the Stockbridge Mill, where later stood the boyhood home of Samuel Woodworth (the poet); and another tract on the northeast side of Walnut Tree Hill just west of the present Queensbush or South Scituate railroad station, which in early times was called Walter Woodworth's Hill.

Various inhabitants were assigned five house lots between 20 Feb. 1634/5 and April 1635 on the

west side of Kent Str., beginning on the north, at the intersection with Meeting House Lane. These town lots were eight rods (132 ft.) wide on Kent Street and extended "80 rods up into the woods."

Walter was a planter and a Surveyor of Highways. As Surveyor of Highways he was responsible for laying out and maintaining the town's roads. Most towns had several surveyors. Each looked after the roads in the section of town in which he lived. In addition each Surveyor was responsible for calling out and supervising the two days of work on the roads which was required annually by each of the town's inhabitants.

Despite the fact that Walter's past in England remains inconclusive, the Plymouth Colony Records contain many entries concerning Walter Woodworth's activities in the new world:

2 Jan. 1633 - Walter "Woodart" in tax lists of those rated for public use at 9 sh. [Plymouth Colony Records, Vol. 1, p. 26, p. 29];

20 Feb. 1634 - Third lot on Kent Street at the corner of Meeting House Lane in the second assignment to Walter Woodworth. The first assignment was 12 April 1633 [Deane, p.9];

1 Dec. 1640 - Walter "Woodward" proposed to be made freeman [Ply. Col. Rec., Vol. 2, p. 3];

2 March 1640/1 - Walter "Woodward" admitted freeman at Plymouth General Court [Ply. Col. Rec., Vol. 2, p. 8];

8 June 1642 - Deed: Annable to Rauline, land adjoining lands of Walter "Woodward" on the east side near Herring Brook [Ply. Col. Rec. Vol. 12, p. 85];

Aug. 1643 - Listed among men from Scituate able to bear arms, 16-60 yrs. - Walter Woodworth [Ply. Col. Rec., Vol. 8, p. 191];

13 Nov. 1643 - Deed: House to Tilden. Lands near North River bounding on marsh land of Walter "Woodward" of Scituate [Ply. Col. Rec., Vol. 12, p. 101];

4 June 1645 - Appointed Surveyor of "Heighwayes" with John Stockbridge at Scituate by General Court [Ply. Col. Rec., Vol. 2, p. 84];

4 June 1645 - Appointed with Thomas Robinson to make equal division of goods in Kempton partnership, a tailor in Scituate [Ply. Col. Rec., Vol. 2, p. 85];

2 June 1646 - Appointed Surveyor of Highways, Scituate [Ply. Col. Rec., Vol. 2, p. 102];

25 March 1650 - Deed: A parcel of marsh land bounded on the west by land of Walter "Woodward," that was once of William Hatch, Sr., and by "the First Herring Brook" [Mayflower Descendants, Vol. 1, p. 92].

In 1653 Walter and William Brooks made inventory of the estate of Thomas Hikes of Scituate.

13 July 1654 he was a member of the First Church, signing by mark, a deed for church land.

3 June 1656 - again appointed Surveyor of Highways [Ply. Col. Rec., Vol. 3, p. 100]

1658 - Listed among the freemen of Scituate, Walter Woodworth [Ply. Col. Rec., Vol. 8, p. 198];

3 June 1662 - Lands granted at Seconett Neck (later Little Compton, R.I.) to "such that were servants and others that are ancient freemen," Walter Woodworth [Ply. Col. Rec., Vol. 4, p. 18];

4 Oct. 1664 - "This Court have likewise granted unto John Hanmore and Walter Woodward of Scituate "who have a right as servants," unto each of them is granted sixty acres of land upon the path going from Bridgewater to Weymouth...." and instructed them "to pay the Indian purchase for it if any bee justly demaunded." [Ply. Col. Rec., Vol. 4, p. 75];

In June, 1665, Plymouth Court directed a request to the townsmen of Scituate that they appoint Cornett Studson and Walter Woodward to assist in settling a boundary dispute of William Randall, if the townsmen are willing.

5 June 1666 - Purchased sixty acres of land

granted to J. Whiston, lying at south side of land granted to Walter Woodworth upon path going from Bridgewater to Weymouth [Ply. Col. Rec., Vol. 4, p. 129];

5 July 1666 - Walter Woodworth taxed for purchase of Indian purchase for the west end of town. [Ply. Col. Rec., Vol. 7, p. 130];

In 1672, Thomas Clapp and Walter Woodworth took an inventory of the estate of William Soane.

In 1673, with Josiah Winslow and 27 others, he was at Plymouth Colony Court to establish right to land in Little Compton, R.I. He received a whole share of the land (then called Seconet), which included Lot #2 in the First Purchase, drawn at Duxbury in 1674.

In 1674, Walter is mentioned as indebted to the estate of Richard Beare of Marshfield.

In 1675, Walter drew two adjoining 50-acre lots in Seconet together with Thomas Williams, in the Second Purchase.

March 1676 - Mary Ingham cleared of charge of witchcraft in relation to 13-year old Mehitable Woodworth, daughter of Walter Woodworth of Scituate [Ply. Col. Rec., Vol. 5, p. 223];

7 July 1681 - Walter Woodworth sues Japhet Turner in land case and recovers damages. [Ply. Col. Rec., Vol. 7, p. 238];

By the late 1650's Walter's name begins to be occasionally entered as Woodworth rather than Woodward, but often varied. As Walter could not write and signed documents "by marke," it probably wasn't of much concern to him.

Walter Woodworth made his Will 26 November 1685 and on 2 March 1686 testimony relating to the Will was taken in Court.

The following is Walter's Will from Genealogical and Family History of the State of Connecticut, 1911, p. 885. A copy also appears in the Descendants of Walter Woodworth by William A. Woodworth.

In the name of God, Amen. I, Walter Woodward, of Scituate, in the jurisdiction of New Plymouth in New England, in America, being weak in body, but of sound and perfect memory, praise to Almighty God for the same, do make this my last will and testament in manner as followeth:

First, and most principally, I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God, my creator, in and through Jesus Christ, my only Saviour and Redeemer, and my body unto decent and.....burial at the discretion of my executors with the advice of the rest of my sons hereafter named.

And my temporal estate I dispose of as hereafter followeth:

Imprimis. I give and bequeath unto Thomas Woodward, my eldest son, a parcel of upland containing five acres, lying in Scituate aforesaid, bounded by the lands of Henry Ewell on the south and the Common on the north, to be enjoined to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give unto my two sons, Thomas and Joseph, ten acres of Marsh land, to be equally divided between them, which lyeth by Suzons-bounded by the Marsh of Anthony Collimer on the east, by the Marsh of Thomas Clap, deceased, on the north, in Scituate aforesaid to be enjoined to them and their heirs forever.

Item: I give to Thomas Woodward, my son, one-third part of all my land at Seconet which I purchased. The other two-thirds I give unto my two sons, Benjamin and Isaac Woodward, to be equally divided between them, to be enjoined to them and their heirs forever, excepting twenty-five acres, of which I do give unto my son Joseph, to be enjoined to him and his heirs forever. Ten acres of which I do give unto my daughter, Martha, to her, her heirs forever, of which two quantities of land is to be deducted out of the two-thirds of my land lying at Seconet given to my two sons, Benjamin and Isaac aforesaid. All the rest of my

land at Seconet, which is yet to be purchased, I give unto my two sons, Thomas and Joseph Woodward, to be divided equally between them, to be enjoined to them and their heirs forever.

Item: I give to Benjamin, my son aforesaid, my dwelling-house with my barns and other outhousing, with all my land, both upland and marshland thereunto belonging, that is to say, twenty acres of upland, be it more or less bounded by land of John Turner to the west and by land of Joseph Otis to the east and six acres of marshland more or less bounded by the land of Joseph Otis to the north-east, and by the first herring brook towards the south -- all of which said housings and land with all the appurtenances thereof, the commons and privileges thereunto belonging I give to the said Benjamin, my son, his heirs forever, always provided upon condition that my son, Benjamin, aforesaid, do pay and allow the sum of seventy pounds unto my son, Joseph, and my six daughters, Sarah, Elizabeth, Mary, Martha, Mehitabel and Abigail, ten pounds apiece, to be paid to them at three payments, viz, one-third part of the said seventy pounds to be paid to my said children within three years after my decease and the other two-thirds to be paid in the two following years, that is to say -- in each year a third of the said sum of seventy pounds, and each payment to be paid, the one-half in silver and the other half to be paid in corn and cattell. Further, my will is that my son Benjamin, aforesaid, do allow my two daughters, Mehitabel and Abigail, the lower room or parlor at the northeasterly end of my dwelling house aforesaid, for their use during the time they do live unmarried.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my said two daughters, Mehitabel and Abigail, my feather bed with the furniture thereunto belonging and all the rest of my houshold goods I give unto my six daughters, Sarah, Elizabeth, Mary, Martha,

Mehitabel and Abigail, to be divided equally among them. The rest of my estate undisposed of by this my last will and testament, I give and bequeath to all my children, all my debts, funeral expenses being first paid, to be equally divided amongst them.

Item: I do constitute and appoint my son, Benjamin, aforesaid, the sole executor of this my last will and testament, whom I do appoint to pay all my debts and legacies and I do appoint my two sons, Thomas and Joseph Woodward, overseers of this last will and testament.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal the twenty six day of November, 1685.

Thomas King, Senior, Thomas Palmer, Charles Stockbridge, the witnesses to this above said Will, appeared before the Court and gave oath that they, the said above Thoe. King, Senior, Thomas Palmer and Charles Stockbridge, did see Walter Woodward above said, sign, seal and deliver this instrument to be his last will and testament, taken before the Court March 2d, 1685-6.

In May of 1985, Victor Montes (a Woodworth family genealogist) and his wife Eve made a trip to the Plymouth County Commissioner's Office, South Russell Street, Plymouth, Mass. 02360, where

Walter's Will is located. He found the Will is made up as a deed and on Pages 382-385, Part 2, Vol. 5 (Deeds), Plymouth Colony Records. This Will is not the original, but a photo copy of it embedded on special paper. Mr. Montes was told he could not have a photo copy, because the light given off from their photo copier would damage the pages and the image of the Will (deed). However, he was informed that he could bring his own camera and with the natural light could take a picture.

In the Descendants of Walter Woodworth by William A. Woodworth, 1898 [hereafter noted as WAW], Walter is given an additional son named Walter Woodworth, Jr., born about 1645 whom today's researchers agree did not exist. The Little Compton records it seems caused this error by inadvertently listing a Walter Woodworth as born 1645 and married 1669. It has been established that these entries appeared in a later copy of the records and are not part of the original Vital Records of Little Compton.

- iv. ELIZABETH, b. about 1647. In 1675 she bore a child out of wedlock,

fathered by Robert Stetson, Jr. of Scituate. He was ordered by the court to pay her 2 sh. a week for the first three months, and afterwards 1 sh. 6 d. until the child was seven years old. Elizabeth's brother Joseph and Robert's father, Robert Stetson, agreed that the verdict was just. Documentation is in records of Plymouth Colony. Elizabeth evidently went elsewhere to live with her child, for no other trace of her has been found in Scituate or R.I. records. It is not known if she married later, but it is certain that she did not marry Robert Stetson, Jr., for he married Joanna or Deborah Brooks in 1676, dau. of William Brooks and removed shortly afterward to Duxbury, Mass. (Material from Barbara A. Cruchon).

"An elderly matron, Mary, wife of Thomas Ingham, of Scituate, was charged with bewitching Walter Woodworth's daughter Mehitabel, causing her to fall into violent fits until almost bereaved of her senses, and so hath greatly languished and all by the 'help of the devil, in a way of witchcraft or sorcery.' Goodwife Ingham pleaded not guilty, and put herself 'on trial of God and the country.' The jurors, well worthy of honorable mention, were Mr. Thomas Huckins, John Wadsworth, John Howland (Second), Abram Jackson, Benaiah Pratt, John Black, Mark Snow, Joseph Bartlett, John Richmond, James Talbot, Seth Pope and _____ . Governor Josiah Winslow presided. The case was duly given to the jury, and they found a verdict of 'Not Guilty.'" [The Pilgrim Republic, pp. 491-4].

2. THOMAS 2 WOODWORTH, son of Walter 1; born perhaps Scituate, Plymouth Co., about 1641 and died Scituate about Feb./March 1718/19.

Thomas married Scituate 8 February 1666 DEBORAH DAMON, born Scituate 25 April 1645 and died after her husband; daughter of Sgt. John and Catherine (Merritt) Damon.

He kept a trader's shop at Scituate. Although, Thomas may have purchased lands at Little Compton, as early as 1674, it is not known if he ever lived there and his name does not appear on a list of First Settlers in Little Compton on that date.

In May 1676 his home was burned by Indians who made an incursion into Scituate and committed extensive damage during King Philip's War.

In 1690 he was chosen "Clerk of the Market" holding that office until 1711; in 1712, he was appointed "Scaler of Weights and Measures," which is understood to be another name for his previous office.

His Will was dated 13 February 1718/19 and proved 17 March following. His wife Deborah was mentioned; son Hezekiah's children; sons John, Ebenezer to have homestead; daughters Deborah Pincen, Catherine Davenport, Mary Vinal, Hannah Jackson, and Jerusha Randall. SEE ADDENDUM.

3. JOSEPH 2 WOODWORTH, son of Walter 1; born Scituate, Plymouth Colony, about 1645 and died there in 1718.

Joseph married Scituate 6 January 1669/70 SARAH STOCKBRIDGE, bp. Scitute 15 March 1645/6 and living December 1712 (date Joseph's Will was made), daughter of John and his second wife Elizabeth (Hatch) Soane Stockbridge. SEE ADDENDUM.

"Elizabeth Hatch, born about 1600; died in New England between 1647 and 1654. She married (1) in England, Robert Soan of Brasted, Co. Kent, who was living on 23 March 1628/9. She married (2) at Scituate, 9 October 1643 as his second wife, John Stockbridge of Scituate; wheelwright. Had one son by first husband and three children by second" [Pack, p. 42].

Joseph is mentioned in the Plymouth records as a freeman in 1689. He was a shopkeeper at Scituate; however, he purchased lands at Little Compton, which he gave to his eldest son. He received lands in Scituate and Seconet from his father and acquired other land mentioned in his Will. He conducted his "trading post" some 60 rods south of the Stockbridge grist mill. It was stated he often assisted in the milling of the grain since the senior Stockbridge had removed to Boston and left the operation in charge of his son, Charles.

Joseph witnessed a pre-nuptial agreement between William Tubbs, Sr. and Dorothy Soane on 23 March 1672.

In the records of the Colony of New Plymouth [7:197], he was one of a jury 7 March 1675 before Governor Josiah Winslow. In the same records, p. 312 in the October court session, Captain John Williams of Scituate complained against Joseph Woodworth and other claimers pretended properties in partnership with the plaintiff in undivided lands in Cohasset, Mass. The action was settled out of court and 42 sh. allowed the defendants. In 1680 his name appears on a petition to the General Court in Plymouth relating to a dispute between two church factions, then threatening to disrupt the town.

Joseph's Will which was allowed 13 June 1718, reads as follows:

In the name of God Amen this third day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and twelve: I Joseph Woodworth of Scituate in the County of Plymouth in New England Husbandman being weak of body, but of sound mind and memory praised be God for it, and considering this tis appointed for men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament. Viz, I commend my soul to God that gave it and my body to decent burial at the discretion of my executor hereafter named and as touching such worldly

estate wherewith God hath blessed me in this life all my just debts and funeral charges being satisfied and paid, I give demise and dispose of the same in manner and form following. Viz.

Imp. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah Woodworth the sole use and improvement of the easterly end of my now dwelling house, and the cellar belonging to it for her comfort and conveniency during the time that she shall remain my widow, and also five pounds per annum to be yearly paid to her after my decease by my executor hereafter named, either in money or in other good merchantable pay at moneys price. And if my said wife shall marry again, then I give unto her the sum of ten pounds in money, to be paid by my executor hereafter named, and also one bed and furniture.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son Joseph all that my estate both of housing and land and meadows lying and being in Little Compton which he the said Joseph is now in the possession and improvement of which said lands and meadows are particularly bounded as by record may appear reference thereunto being had to have and to hold to him, his heirs and assigns forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin all that my estate of housing and lands whereon I now dwell, said lands containing fifty acres be it more or less, bounded easterly partly to ye lands of Thomas Woodworth; partly to ye meadow southerly to the giver westerly to the lands of Thomas Woodworth, northerly to the Common. Also ten acres of fresh meadow be it more or less bounded easterly to the Brush Hill, northerly to Thomas Woodworth's meadow, southerly to the River, westerly to the above-mentioned upland. Also a certain piece of salt marsh, being the one half part of a ten acre lot of meadow that lyes in partnership betwixt my brother Thomas Woodworth, said meadows lying at Susan's Neck. Also three

acres of salt marsh be it more or less, lying between the Third and Fourth Clift, which I had of John Hyland in way of exchange. Also all my town rights and common privileges in Scituate aforesaid together with one lot of cedar swamp lying and being in Black Pond Cedar swamp. To have and to hold all the above mentioned premises with the with the appurtenances thereof, unto him the said Benjamin Woodworth, his heirs and assigns forever.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my daughter Margaret fifty pounds in good and lawful bills of credit of this Province to be paid by my executor hereafter named.

Item: I give unto my daughter Sarah fifty pounds in good and lawful bills of credit of this Province to be paid by my executor hereafter named.

Item: I give unto my daughter Elizabeth the sum of fifty pounds in good and lawful bills of credit of this Province to be paid by my executor hereafter named.

Item: I give unto my daughter Abigail the sum of fifty pounds in good and lawful bills of credit of this Province to be paid by my executor hereafter named.

Item: I give unto my daughter Ruth the sum of fifty pounds in good and lawful bills of credit of this Province to be paid by my executor hereafter named.

And it is my mind and will that the above granted legacies be fully paid and performed to my said daughters in manner and form following. Viz: twenty pounds within one year after my decease to be equally divided among them, that is to say four pounds a piece and twenty pounds more within the space of two years after my decease, to be paid and divided equally among them as aforesaid. And, that the said payments of twenty pounds per annum shall be paid yearly and every year to my daughters aforesaid, until all the above granted

legacies be fully satisfied and paid. Further it is my mind and will that my household goods should be equally divided among my said daughters immediately after my decease. Lastly, I do by these presents constitute and appoint my beloved son Benjamin to be my sole executor to this my Last Will and Testament, hereby renouncing and disannulling all other wills and testaments, declaring this and no other to be my last will and testament.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year first above written.

4. BENJAMIN 2 WOODWORTH, son of Walter 1; born Scituate, Plymouth Colony, about 1649 and died Lebanon, Conn., 22 April 1728. His Will is dated Lebanon 21 January 1726; proved 3 July 1728.

Benjamin married (1) before 1682 DEBORAH (perhaps BENJAMIN) [Torrey 102:151]; he married (2) before 1689 HANNAH (perhaps DAMON). Death dates and last names of his wives are unknown at this time.

On the 23rd day of June 1692, Benjamin sold his land at Scituate, his second wife Hannah signing the deed with him, and he removed to Little Compton, Bristol Co., Mass. Bay, where his brother Isaac had preceded him.

In 1703, Benjamin removed again to Lebanon and bought a large tract of land from Phillip Smith on 25 February 1703, and was admitted as inhabitant of the town on 22 December 1704. His farm was situated in the northeast part of the town, and on account of its remoteness from the church, he with others, petitioned in 1714 for a new church. In 1716 this new church was formed called Lebanon North Parish; later the town of Columbia.

In Lebanon land records [2:469] we find: "Moses Woodworth of Norwich sold to Benjamin Woodworth of Lebanon five acres in Little Compton, Bristol Co., Colony of Mass. Bay, land being one-third of a 15-acre tract which was originally Walter

Woodworth's."

Benjamin deeded land to his eldest son Benjamin in December 1712; to sons Ichabod and Ebenezer 13 February 1717/8; to son Amos 6 May 1720; to son Ezekiel who was "to care for his honored father and mother" 6 May 1723; to youngest son Caleb 21 January 1726/7.

On 4 November 1714, Benjamin is said to have received land for service rendered in King Phillip's War. It is believed this account may have become confused with a Benjamin Woodward who was killed in that war.

Children mentioned in Benjamin's Will, but not recorded in Lebanon or Little Compton [Genealogical & Family History of the State of Connecticut, 1911, p. 885].

Benjamin's Will: "In the name of God amen ye 21st day of January 1726/7. I, Benjamin Woodworth of Lebanon in ye County of Wendham and Colony of Connecticut in New England being very sick and weake in body but of perfect mind and memory - thanks be given unto God therefore calling to mind ye mortality of my body and knowing that it is appinted for all men once to dey, do make and ordain this my last will and testament. That is to say princeaply and first of all I give and recomend my soul in to ye hands of God that gave it and my body I recomend to ye earth to be beuried in decent Christian Beuril at ye discretion of my executor - nothing doubting but that at ye generall resurrection I shall receive ye same again by ye mighty power of God - and as touching such worldly estate where with it had pleased God to bless me - with in this life I give demise and dispose of ye same in ye following maner and form: Imp - I give and bequeath to my well beloved and eldest son Benjamin Woodworth twenty acres of my common right that is laid out joyning to his land that I gave formerly given to him to be first laide out to him begining at ye highway ye wholl

wedth as it is laide out and bounded on record and run so far by and ajoyning to his former land so far as to make twenty acres -

Item: I give and bequeath unto my sons Benjamin, Ichabod and Ebenezer Woodworths all ye remaining part of my common right of land that is laide out ajoyning to that twenty acres above sd given to Benjamin - to be equally devided to my three sons Benjamin, Ichabod and Ebenezer they paying so much to my daughters as ye sd land shall be aprised at to be paide with in five years after my decease -and in case that my three sons Benjamin Ichabod and Ebenezer do not so cause to take ye sd lands and pay so much: to be devided amongst my daughters heare after named that ye ad lands shall be equally devided amongst them my daughter.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my son Amos Woodworth 33 acres and two 3ds of an acre of land ajoyning to that lot of land on Chusnut Hill that I have formarly given to him he paying twenty pounds to my daughtars with in five years after my deceas and in case he shall refuse to pay ye twenty pounds within the five years as afore sd that then ye sd 33 acres and two 3ds of an acre of land to be equally devided amongst them -

Item: I give and bequeath unto my sons Ezekieil and Caleb Woodworths all thos two tracts or persals of land that I purchased of Capt. Joseph Marsh ajoyning to ye farm where my now dweling hows now stands to be equally devided between them they paying all my just debts and in case they shall refuse to pay all my debts that then ye sd persels of land shall be sold to pay my just debts.

Item: I give and bequeath to my children both sons and daughtars heare named in this my last will and testament all my right of land or aney estate that of right dos belong to me at or within the bounds of Seconet in ye provence of Masachuse Bay and County of Bristoll they all being at equal charge in recovering ye same other wise ye charge to be payde out of ye part in proportion: and I do heareby likewise make and ordain my son Benjamin Woodworth my sole executor of this my last will and testement - heareby I do utterly disallow revoack and disanull all and every other and former testements wills legasies and bequests and executors by me in any ways before named willed and bequeathed ratiefieing and confirmeng this and no other to be my last will and testement. In witness whereof I have heare unto set my hand and seall the day and year first above mentioned."

Note: In 1982 G. Alan Royce (a Woodworth Family Genealogist) of Erdenheim, Penn., analyzed the problem of too many Caleb Fitch's married to too many Ruth Woodworth's. "Ruth (#4-viii) Woodworth is in some sources stated to have married Caleb Fitch. Unless there were two or three Caleb Fitches (which is doubtful, since I can only find one) who married a Ruth Woodworth according to the records, I do not believe this Ruth ever married Caleb Fitch. From The Waterman Family by Jacobus & Waterman, Vol. 1, p. 655: Children of Nathaniel and Ann (Abel) Fitch, b. at Lebanon (12) youngest Caleb, b. 17 June 1725 and d. 19 March 1750, Lebanon; m. there (other records all say Bozrah), 4 April 1747, Ruth Woodworth.

According to some sources, there were two other Ruth Woodworths who also married Caleb Fitch: (1) Ruth, daughter of Joshua (#22) Woodworth, b. 27 April 1730, Norwich, Conn. They were married at Bozrah, so for geographical reasons as much as anything, it is my belief that it is this Ruth who m. Caleb Fitch. (2) Ruth, daughter of Joseph (#26) Woodworth, b. 23 Jan. 1728, at Little Compton. This family later lived at Lebanon, and she may be the right Ruth.

By now, it is apparent that I do not think that Ruth, daughter of Benjamin (#4) Woodworth ever married a Caleb Fitch. At least she didn't marry the one I found, because he wasn't born until 1725. I believe Joseph Owen was her only husband. The 11 children are listed in the Owen Genealogy; how many of them were by his first wife and how many by Ruth, is not known at this point. I think that this is one of those errors made years ago that has been perpetuated over the years and is difficult to get rid of."

5. ISAAC 2 WOODWORTH, son of Walter 1; born perhaps Scituate, Plymouth Colony about 1660 and died Norwich, Conn. 1 April 1714, leaving his wife and nine children.

Isaac married perhaps Scituate about 1684 LYDIA STANDLICK, daughter of Richard and Lydia Standlick [Plymouth Colony Records, Deeds dated 28 April 1701].

He is mentioned as "Isaac Woodward of Little Compton in Ye County of Bristol," in the New England Historical and Genealogical Register.

In 1705 he was admitted as a Freeman by a vote of Norwich inhabitants. He was a carpenter and built the second meeting house in Norwich.

He made his Will 5 January 1713/14, and it was proved 13 April 1714, his son Moses being executor. The ages of the children ranged from 8 to 27 in 1714 according to the probate file.

He married Little Compton as early as 1694 REBECCA as indicated by deeds; however, her family name is not known. It has been said she was Rebecca Symmes/Simmons, daughter of Aaron and Mary (Woodworth) Simmons, however, this Rebecca was not

born until 2 December 1679 and married Timothy White 1 January 1707/8.

Joseph lived his married life at Little Compton until around 1734 when they went to Lebanon.

Little Compton deeds [17:105], then Bristol County, Mass. Bay, 1 March 1725/6, Joseph Woodworth of Little Compton sold acreage to Elihu Woodworth for 850 pounds, he, Joseph having "a good and perfect estate of inheritance in fee simple." Rebecca, his wife, released her dower rights the next day.

Ann was an aunt of Margaret Torrey who married in 1723 Jedediah [#27] Woodworth, nephew of Benjamin.

It is felt that this Benjamin married only once. Some accounts err in supposing that it was Benjamin who married as a first wife 17 August 1712, Mary Wright, but the Benjamin Woodward of that marriage was born 31 May 1690, son of Robert. They had 8 children born in Scituate and this family moved to Leicester and Spencer, Mass." [McArthur, p. 36].

Ebenezer married Lebanon 27 December 1717 REBECCA SMALLEY, Mayflower Descendant, and daughter of Benjamin and Rebecca (Snow) Smalley. Rebecca's marriage listed as Mayflower #30811 and Ebenezer's marriage listed as Mayflower #31660; descendants are eligible as Mayflower Society

members.

On 20 November 1784 his son, Ebenezer, Jr., sold land he had purchased of his honored father.

Ebenezer made his Will 31 October 1765, and it was probated 10 October 1785. His Will mentions his four sons, Viz. Ebenezer, Eliphalet, Joseph and Amasa to whom "three shilling lawful money, which with what I have already given them by deed is the whole of their part of my Estate."

also appears in a rate bill for Columbia Church in 1741.

An Amos of Lebanon had Jesse Negus indentured to him in June, 1742. He could not have been the Amos of Windham who died 1765 and had a son Ebenezer old enough to have a married daughter in 1754. This Ebenezer must have been born before 1720. It is doubtful there were children.

15. EZEKIEL 3 WOODWORTH, son of Benjamin 2 and Hannah (Walter 1); born about 1696; called "of Lebanon" and died Lebanon 20 July 1745 (7?).

He married Second Church, Scituate, 14 November 1723 LYDIA SIMMONS, born 27 March 1693 and died Lebanon 1792 (?), daughter of Aaron and Mary (Woodworth #1-vi) Simmons.

Benajah Bill was appointed guardian for Benjamin; Jonathan Clark appointed guardian for Peleg and released from that responsibility 22 July 1752; and John Dewey was appointed guardian of Mary.

Ezekiel's Will is as follows: "In the name of God Amen the fifteenth day of July 1747, I, Ezekiel Woodwarth of Lebanon being in a weak and languishing condition of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to dye do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principlly and first of all I give and recomend my soul into the hands of God that gave it and my body I recomend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discesion of my executor nothing doubting but at the generall resurrection I shall receive the same by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly goods or estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give demise and dispose of in manner and form as followeth:

Imprimis: I give and bequeth unto Lydia my

dearly beloved wife one third part of my real estate during her natural life together with one third part of my personal estate to be at her dispose for ever.

Item: I give unto my beloved sons Benjamin Woodwarth and Peleg Woodwarth all my housing and land to be equally divided betwixt them they paying all my just debts and funerall expences.

Item: I give unto my beloved daughters Lydia Woodwarth and Mary Woodwarth all the rest of my personal estate which I have not in this my last will and testament given to my beloved wife sd good or estate to be equally divided between them. And further, I do by these presents make and ordain my eldest son Benjamin Woodwarth my sole executor of this my last will and testament: and do by these presents rattyfy and confirm this as my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written.

Be it known to all men by these presents that whereas I Ezekiel Woodwarth of Lebanon have made and declared my last Will and Testament in writing bearing date July 15th 1747, I the sd Ezekiel Woodwarth do by this present codicil ratify and confirm my sd last will and testament only with this alteration in that whereas in my sd will I gave to my two daughters Lydia and Mary Woodwarth all my personal estate which I had not bequethed to my beloved wife, I do now give and bequeth unto my 2 sons Benjamin and Peleg Woodwarth one yoak of oxen one house and all my farming tools or utensials and all my carpenters tools to be delivered to them by my executor and my will and meaning is that this codicil or schedule be and be ajuded to be part and parcel of my last will and testament and that all things here in mentioned and contained be faithfully and truly performed in all

respects as if the same had been declared and set down in my last will and testament as witness my hand and seal this 20 day of July 1747."

Ephraim was a Captain in Van Veghten's 4th Co. 13th Regiment Albany Co., N.Y., Militia, under Colonel John McCrea and took part in the capture of Burgoyne at Saratoga in the Battle of Bemis Heights. His home was headquarters for Gen. Gates during those battles [N.Y. State Archives, 271]. His sons Ephraim and Reuben were in his Company during part of the Revolution.

Ephraim was evidently of some means and in 1790 owned two slaves. A weaver.

A child Isaac Woodworth born Stillwater about 1786 and died before 1818 (?) may be son of Ephraim and Anna. In 1745 moved with his parents to Cambridge.

William served in the Revolution in the 16th Cambridge Regiment as First Lieutenant, N.Y. Militia under Colonel Lewis VanWoert and was with General Stark in his operation against Bennington and with General Gates at Saratoga in 1777.

In 1776 supposedly lived Charlotte Precinct of Dutchess Co., NY [WAW, pp. 109, 110].

In 1790 Census, Albany Co., Town of Cambridge, N.Y., William's family is listed with 3 male over 16 including head; and 9 females including wife. His farm was about a mile and a half east of Cambridge Village in what is now White Creek.

He invented the planing, tonguing, and grooving machine. There was a great deal of litigation as regards a patent infringement - Thomas W. Olcott vs William and Henry Hawkins, U. S. Territorial Court, Milwaukee, Wisc. (1847-48). His rights as patentee were not fully established until after his death. It was through the efforts of his son that a court fight was won and a patent was issued 27 December 1848. [Howard's U. S. Supreme Court Report, p. 645]

48. SOLOMON 4 WOODWORTH, son of Caleb and Jane (Benjamin 2, Walter 1); born Salisbury, Litchfield Co., Conn., 4 May 1748 and died 7 September 1781; killed in an Indian ambush near Fort Dayton, New York. Buried where they fell.

He married by J. Lee, Salisbury, 13 October 1770 [Salisbury Assoc. Vital Records, Vol. II, p. 122]. PHEBE THORNTON, her parents and/or date of birth not known.

Solomon was listed as Lieutenant and Captain, New York Militia in Revolution in Tyron Co. Militia [DAR #159773].

He removed to Mayfield, Fulton Co., New York with his brother Selah, purchasing a tract of land southwest of the village. The Indians at this time were very troublesome; therefore, Selah tried to induce his brother to return with him to Conn. Solomon would not consent to this and proceeded to locate on the Brooks Farm, which was but a short distance from a house that he built as a stockade in which to shield himself from hostile Indian assault. The increasing hostilities of the British and their savage allies made the homes of the few pioneers especially vulnerable to danger; and Solomon found it necessary during these perilous times to remain inside the stockade at night. A Mayflower writer of some years ago states: "Here in the winter of 1780 Solomon Woodworth was attacked by a party of Indians. Being short of bullets, his faithful wife laid her little child by the fire and with the spirit that characterized heroines at that time ran bullets as fast as her husband could shoot. The result was the retreat of the Indians and Tories with one wounded. Early in the morning Captain Woodworth rallied a few of

his band, followed the retreating party for three days, and at length surprised and killed them all."

Immediately after this successful expedition Solomon was appointed Lieutenant in a company of nine-months' men. At the expiration of this term in the year of 1781, he was appointed Captain for the purpose of forming a company of rangers to explore the woods. He at once raised a Company of able-bodied soldiers, all well armed and equipped. From Fort Dayton, he started at the head of his little band in a northerly direction to range the woods. His band became surrounded by an Indian ambush, outnumbering them two to one. A short, but bloody and decisive conflict ensued. Captain Woodworth was killed and only 15 men out of 41 escaped; all the rest either killed or taken prisoners. [Mayfield, Fulton Co., NY Archives record].

There is considerable confusion as to the number of children Solomon had. Only Caleb is on record at Salisbury. One account states Solomon had 3 sons - Caleb, Elijah, Solomon and 3 daughters, not named. Another account states there were 4 daughters.

Selah moved to Mayfield, N.Y., soon after his marriage with Solomon and Jacob Dunham (Rebecca's father); they being among the first settlers to obtain land there. The Town of Mayfield was for the greater part laid out on Selah's land.

After a few years, Selah and the family returned to Conn. There he became a Sargeant in Captain Little's Co. 3rd N.Y. Regiment under Colonel Fisher. He took part in the Battle of Oriskany. After the War his family returned to Mayfield.

Selah was chosen Supervisor of Mayfield at first Town Meeting 1 April 1794.

He deeded land 28 January 1823 for the Methodist Church. Inside the door of the church is a plaque "Selah Woodworth, who founded this church in the year 1830, b. Aug. 11, 1750; d. Oct 25, 1823."

In 1790 Census, Thetford, Vermont, there was a Levi and in 1800 Census there was an Elijah; either one of whom may have been sons of Elijah. On the other hand, they could also have been sons of his brother David. In 1800 Census Elijah is recorded between 26-45 and had a son under 10 and wife between 16-26 and two other members in his family; no relationship indicated.

The names of his wife and children do not appear anywhere with certainty, indicating he may have died young. Although WAW lists Nathan, Ziba, Betsey and Lola as children; Ziba is almost positively erroneous.

Member of Lebanon Church in 1749.

There is no evidence he was married.

He served in the French and Indian War from
Conn. On 1 May 1759 he was in Captain Fitch's
Lebanon Company and on 16 April of that year he
was in Captain Host's Lebanon Company from Goshen,
Conn.

He married SARAH, perhaps daughter of Caleb

May 1758; and on a muster roll of Captain Fitch's
Lebanon Company. In 1761 he was a Sergeant in
Captain McNeal's Co. [Connecticut Historical
Collection 2:48, 142, 178, 280].

He was living in 1790 as established from
Conn. Public Records: "Sarah Woodworth wife of
David Woodworth of East Windsor, Hartford Co.,
made petition to the Conn. Assembly in May 1790

showing that for a number of years past her husband David had been deprived of his reason and that she is no longer able to support herself and children and represents that her husband is possessed of 26 acres with a small house in East Windsor which she the said Sarah owned before her marriage with said David and she applies for permission to sell it." The permission was granted.

He married (1) at Groton, Conn., before 1750 SUSANNAH STREET, born Groton, 19 December 1722 daughter of Nicholas and Jerusha Street. He married (2) ELIZABETH (?). He may be the Benjamin who married Bozrah 4 May 1758 ELIZABETH SIMMS.

At a meeting of the Governor and Committee of Safety held at Lebanon 28 May 1782, Benjamin presented a petition for assistance showing that two of his sons had been wounded at Groton Heights

in defense of the fort and that he had been at much expense in nursing them. It is certain that one of those sons referred to was Azel and the other was no doubt Ziba who was wounded in the battle.

In 1790 was perhaps living at Hartford, Windsor Co., Vermont with wife and no children.

Information on this family is uncertain. WAW in his book was able to locate only 9 children; however, another source states there were 19 children indicating that Benjamin most probably was married at least twice.

Abner [records show "Woodard"] served as a private in Captain Benjamin Clark's Company, Colonel Obadiah Johnson's Regiment, Conn. Militia in the Revolutionary War in the State of Rhode Island. He entered camp 8 January 1778 and served for two months and the roll dated at Providence, Rhode Island, 16 February 1778 shows him present.

After Hannah's death he packed up his cobbler's tools and driving a cow, made his way by foot to Yates Co., New York, to reside with a daughter until his death.

He married 12 May 1767 by Rev. Eleazer Wheelock, ADAH [listed on pension record], parentage unknown. In Columbia, Conn., VR, Deaths, called "JERRY, widow of Jedediah, died 10 March 1837, age 95 years."

He was on the French and Indian War rolls for Conn. as having served in Vermont in 1760; in the campaign of 1761/2; served as a drummer boy. He enlisted 2 March 1762 and was discharged 2 December of that year.

He served in the Conn. line during the Revolution and was granted a pension under the Act of 1818.

In 1790 Census, Jedediah lived at Lebanon and beside himself and wife, one male under 16 and one

female were listed.

79. BENJAMIN 5 WOODWORTH, son of Benjamin 4 and Hannah (Benjamin 3, Joseph 2, Walter 1); born Scituate, Mass. 15 June 1750; bp. 17 June 1750 and died there 5 August 1830.

He married (1) 26 November 1778 [marriage intention 14 November 1778] ABIGAIL BRYANT, born Scituate 31 December 1747 and there died about 1802, daughter of Samuel and Mary (Buck) Bryant. He married (2) Scituate 8 May 1803, BETTY (BROWN) NORTHEY, widow of Captain Joseph Northey.

Benjamin's father died when he was about 12. The family having little means, it was necessary for Benjamin to start working early. From records left by his son Samuel, it appears that Benjamin was employed as lad-of-all work in the family of an Episcopal Minister, Reverend Ebenezer Thompson, Rector of St. Andrews Church in the south parish of Scituate and among other duties rang the bell in this church. At a later date he was bound out as an apprentice to a house carpenter in Boston. However, as he was an adventurous lad he soon relinquished his trade and became a sailor.

He was a soldier in the Revolution and at the age of 25 he enlisted as a Private at Cambridge and was at the taking of Dorchester Heights. He served first in Captain Otis' Company of "Royal

Americans at Scituate" as private which marched at the Lexington Alarm of 19 April 1775; then he enlisted 10 May 1775 in Captain Samuel Stockbridge's Company, Colonel John Thomas' regiment. He also served the following year in Captain Nathaniel Winslow's Co., Colonel Simeon Cary's Regiment, his name appearing from 12 February to 1 November 1776. In December 1776, he was in Captain Francis Cushing's Co., Colonel John Cushing's Regiment which marched on an alarm to Bristol, Rhode Island. An official record shows that still later he was Sergeant in Captain William Barker's Co., Colonel Theophilus Cotton's Regiment being discharged 30 March 1781 after serving in Rhode Island. Mass. Soldiers and Sailors of the War of the Revolution [17:872-73] lists him in many muster rolls and returns.

Upon his first marriage the young couple set up housekeeping in a small humble house in "The Harbor" where Steinbeck's store was in recent years; their four children were born here. After his second marriage he moved with his children to the Northey home. The house and farm had been in the possession of the Northey family since 1675 at which time John Northey purchased it from Thomas Ingham (whose wife Mary was accused of bewitching Mehitable, daughter of Walter Woodworth). This house is still standing and is one of the historic points of interest in Scituate. It is the site of "The Old Oaken Bucket."

He married Pembroke, Mass., 8 January 1781 RUTH STAPLES who died Bowdoinham 7 May 1837.

James moved from Harpswell to Bowdoinham about 1791. For the remainder of his life he lived on a farm about three miles from Bowdoinham Village.

From the Revolutionary records at the State House, Boston, Mass., James Woodworth enlisted from South Hanover, Mass., 19 April 1775 for eight months' service. He attained the rank of Captain under Captain Amos Turner; Colonel John Bailey.

In 1775 enlisted for 12 months under Captain Weed and Colonel John Bailey. Enlisted February 1777 for three years under Captain Judah Allen and Colonel John Bailey. Spent the winter of 1777-1778 at Valley Forge. June 1780 to 27 March 1781 under Captain Luther Bailey. In his declaration for pension May 1818, James states: "My name is Woodworth, but I am familiarly and almost universally called Woodward and thus my discharge is written." Silveste Page, Ruth Small, Emma Sparks, James Woodworth and Mary Sanford were pensioned as the only surviving children.

He was blind for quite a number of years in later life.

"Jones" owned a piece of land at Freeport, Maine, as is shown by deeds from James Woodworth to William Haskell of Harpswell, Maine, 18 January 1781: "Isaac Jones Woodworth of Scituate, Plymouth Co., Yeoman, for 50 pounds paid by James Woodworth of North Yarmouth in the County of Cumberland, yeoman, sell 14 acres of land lying in Scituate, where my honored father, Joseph Woodworth, now lives, in three small pieces on both sides of the highway that leads from John Hatch's to Prince Otis', with the dwelling house and barn standing on the same.... said house and

land is the same which I purchased of Joseph Burk. Signed, Isaac Jones Woodworth." It would seem from this Deed that Isaac Jones sold his house in Scituate, Mass., to James Woodworth, and that Jones Woodworth then went to Harpswell or to Prout's Gore and bought part of land which James Woodworth had bought of Timothy Bailey 19 August 1788. To this last Deed, Jones Woodworth was a witness, so that he must have been at Harpswell at this time. In 1791 he reserved such land as he had sold to James Woodworth. "Jones" married and had three daughters. SEE ADDENDUM.

He married, wife unknown who died before 1838.

Swift served in the Revolutionary War enlisting in 1775 as a private. Was with Captain Clark and General Putnam in the Battle of Bunker Hill [from Military and Pension File, National Archives].

Swift applied for pension at Elba, Genesee Co., New York, in 1832 having previously lived at Columbia and Lebanon, Conn., according to pension file.

Swift's son Charles is listed as oldest son in Swift's probate record indicating there were other children:

To the Descendants of Timothy Ingraham: Information Respecting the Great Ingraham Estate in the Kingdom of Great Britain, by G. R. Gladding, Providence, R.I., 1859

"The Ingraham Estate, so called, was the property of my great great grandfather, Joseph Wilson of Yorkshire, England, who died about 1680 and left it by will to his only daughter Sarah, who married Edward Cowell of Yorkshire. After their marriage they moved to Boston, MA, and had only one child, Sarah (Cowell), who was born in Boston 2 July 1660 and who married Timothy Ingraham, son of William Ingraham of Boston. Timothy and wife removed to Bristol, R.I., in 1680.

They had 7 children born there, whose descendants are heirs of the estate. Three of the children died without issue; the descendants of the others now (1859) number about 100 persons...

The estate as left by will to Sarah Cowell, was entailed to the fourth generation, till which the lands could not be sold. The present claimants being of the fifth generation, that limitation has expired.

The estate, at the death of Joseph Wilson, was several miles in length and width (about 6 x 3), but was of little comparative value.....The estate, having a fine stream of water flowing through it, became a seat of manufacturing industry which has grown up into the present city of Leeds, which explains the present immense value of the estate.

Sarah (Wilson) Cowell, the legatee under the will, left that document to her daughter, Sarah

(Cowell) Ingraham of Bristol, R.I.

The first effort made to recover the estate was by Jeremiah Ingraham, son of Timothy and Sarah (Cowell) Ingraham, a grandson of Edward and Sarah (Wilson) Ingraham, in 1803. He was an East India captain and sailed with his wife from New York, taking all the papers connected with the estate. His wife testifies that he put them in the hands of Mr. Erskine of London, an eminent lawyer, and sailed for Madras, where he died; his wife returning to this country.

Mr. Erskine (later Lord Erskine) was soon after made Lord Chancellor of England, which made it impossible for him to act any longer as a solicitor....Nothing further was done until about 1825, when the heirs learned that London papers had advertised for the heirs to the estate..... The first Lord Erskine was dead, and the papers that were placed in his hands by Capt. Solomon Ingraham had passed into the possession of his son, the late Lord Erskine, who was then a minister to Belgium, while the papers were locked up in London. (The agent for the heirs returned to America without getting access to them.)

No further effort was made until 1852, when the present agent (the author), in company with Columbus Smith, a lawyer, went to London and saw the late Lord Erskine. He was living at Brighton, 50 miles from London. He acknowledged finding the documents among his father's papers, affirmed they were safe in London, and that Messrs. Gladding and Smith could have them as soon as he could find time to look for them. Despite his daily promises to do so, they waited four months and he (then more than 80 years old) never found the time. He died in March 1857 (?), and all his papers passed into the hands of his eldest son, the present (1859) Lord Erskine....

Search of public records failed to disclose anything about the aforesaid will of Joseph Wilson;

He was one of the original settlers of Dorchester, Grafton Co., Vermont, where he and his brother bought a large tract of land.

He married ANNA WOODWORTH, born Lebanon 20 February 1758 and died West Williamsfield, Ashtabula Co., Ohio, 22 August 1832, daughter of Peleg and Mary (Tyrel) Woodworth. Ezra moved to Dorchester, N.H., with his brothers probably in the 1780's and about 1800 was a resident of Essex, Vermont.

He enlisted at Lebanon, June 1780 as a private under Washington; also served under Captain Andrew Fitch and Colonel John Durkee, Pvt. 4th Conn. Regiment from 13 July 1780 to December 1780; no battles were mentioned but service was chiefly along the Hudson River in New York and New Jersey.

In 1807 Ezra went to Ohio and was one of the first settlers of Williamsfield, Ashtabula Co. where he farmed. He was a teacher and elder in the Congregational Church.

Ezra and wife are probably the elderly couple enumerated with L. Woodworth (son Luther) in the 1830 Wayne Twp. Census.

Ezra applied for pension 16 August 1832 residing that date at West Williamsfield, age 69. The claim was allowed [Certificate #4733].

Elihu inherited his lands from his father.
 Deeds show that Elihu bought up many of the Island
 lots until eventually he owned upwards of 130
 acres of upland - over 1/2 of the total area of
 Long Island. He built a house, Site 21, which was
 slightly north and east of the present dwelling,
 Site 20.

He was assigned a mark for his cattle on 24

November 1785, being a square crop on the left ear and a slit in the same.

Elihu sold lands to Jonathan Hamilton in 1811.

A prosperous farmer, he also write deeds, surveyed, financed mortgages, assessed property and was a Deacon in the Covenanter Church. He was an intensively occupied and active gentlemen, and even after retirement age made frequent trips about the province surveying, acting as arbitrator or carrying out church business. His diary for 1835-36 gives a glimpse of the man and his activities when aged 64. He was devoted to his church and was a Deacon at a time when Rev. Mr. Sommerville was pastor. Services were held once a month by Mr. Sommerville in Cornwallis and the remaining Sundays in the Covenanter Church in Grand Pre. Elihu helped with Communion, conducted services when Mr. Sommerville was away and made his house available for mid-week prayers. Church duties occupied most of his time and regardless of weather, alone or with the pastor, he visited members of the congregation, especially the sick and aged.....[Eagles, p. 39].

He maintained a variety of livestock-sheep, hogs, oxen, cattle and horses. Aside from regular farming duties, Elihu showed many talents of a successful pioneer as showed by entries in his diary: made hayfork handles, made a pair of shoes, sheared sheep, dressed and breaking flax, curried calf skin, repaired my wagon, chopped wood, making candles, engaged with my leather, put shoes on Mr. Sommerville's horse, caught muskrat, sowed turnips, hoed potatoes, etc..... [Eagles, p. 40].

As early as 17 April 1805, he was involved in surveying lands in the township, and the Court of General Sessions records the "laying out of a road from Little Island to Boot Island, across the marsh in Horton, by Sherman Denison and Elihu Woodworth - Surveyors of Highways, the said Elihu Woodworth being a Deputy Surveyor of Lines and

Bounds." Elihu continued this profession even after his retirement, although to a limited extent since he was so involved in his church work.

As Elihu and Sabra neared retirement, they sold the farm to two sons, Benjamin and Samuel. In 1825, they received 60 acres in the North Tier, and later the lands in the South Tier were split between them, with Benjamin receiving the portion adjoining the Davison farm together with the home-
stead, while Samuel received the eastern half. Samuel married and built a house east of the home-
stead, sharing the use of the woodhouse, horse stable and barn. A road, commonly referred to as the Woodworth Road, divided the two properties, connecting the Island Road to the Minas Shore and running about 1/3 mile across the dyke before turning west to meet the Middle Dyke Road [Eagles, p. 41].

On 13 April 1874, the trustees of the Island School Section No. 75, Messrs R. I. Palmeter and Elihu Woodworth, purchased a parcel of land, 25 feet by 30, for one dollar, from Leander Palmeter for the building of a school.

Note: From History of Franklin and Grand Isle Counties, VT, edit. by Lewis Cass Aldrich, 1891, p. 542: Town of Fletcher:

"John Fullington of Deerfield, New Hampshire, began the first clearing in town on the river farm...in 1787 or 1788. He put up a shanty and returned to Deerfield, N.H., for his wife and four children. They had 1 horse and 1 cow to drive... ..Two men who had land in the S.E. part of Fairfax were with them. Within the limits of Johnson, they encamped for the night near the banks of the Lamoille River. Here Mr. Fullington found a patch of turnips and improvidently ate one raw, which produced a severe attack of bilious colic and caused his death in a few hours. He was buried the next day. Mrs. Fullington and the little ones proceeded down the river to the home provided for them, and here the widow became the mother of the first white child born in town, and named her Lamoille, from the river." This text makes it sound as if Lamoille was the child of John Fullington, but most other references say she was a Woodworth. Could she have been adopted by Woodworth?

In 1800 Census was at Burlington, Vermont, with 1 male 45 or older, 1 male between 10-16 and one female 45 and older.

By 1818 had moved to Ogdensburg, St. Lawrence Co., New York.

In 1820 applied for Revolutionary War Pension. Was in Colonel Dedell's Regiment, New Hampshire line from January 1776 to 1777.

James lived in Tolland until 8 years of age. His mother died 26 April 1770 when he was about 4 and he then lived 4 years with his grandfather Terryl. He was bound out to live with Jonathan Bliss of Wilbraham, Mass., and lived with him 8 years. At 16 years he went to learn the mason trade with Asa Ayres of Wilbraham. After his marriage to Lucretia Catlin, they lived in South Hadley on a 19-acre farm near the center of town until the year 1803.

Asa Ayres is listed in the 1790 Census at South Hadley; the only Asa Ayres listed in Mass. It is probable that while James was serving his apprenticeship, Asa moved from Wilbraham to South Hadley, only a few miles away, James going with him.

James is not listed in the 1790 Census, but his father-in-law, Samuel Catlin is. There is one extra male over 16 listed in the household. Could this be James Woodworth?

James is listed in South Hadley, Hampshire Co., Mass., in the 1800 Census, the family consisting of himself and wife and 8 children: 2 males under 10; 1 male 10-16; four females under 10; and one female 10-16.

Ensign of the 4th Company or train band in the 12th Regiment of the State of Connecticut.

On 3 February 1803, he moved to Bolton, Washington Co., New York, which is on the west side of Lake George. After the Revolution, men came to the wild wooded area; the majority settling on the hilltops overlooking the lake, the main artery of the area, and the balance on the narrow lake plain. Farming and lumbering was the main source of income [Brown, p. 126].

In the Bolton Census of 1810, James is listed with his wife and 10 children; 4 sons to 10; 1 son 10-16; one daughter to 10; 1 daughter 10-16; and 3 daughters 16-26.

James bought land in Bolton but the deed has not been found either in Washington Co. (the original county) or Warren Co. He disposed of this land in a deed recorded in the County Clerk's office at Lake George [Book A, p. 246]. On 1 June 1812, James Woodworth and Lucretia Woodworth his wife granted to Reuben Armstrong 57 acres of land in Bolton, part of the land patent to Lena Hitchcock and Philip, for a consideration of \$1200. The deed was not acknowledged until 9 February 1815 and was recorded the next day.

The notes of Harvey Woodworth, state that his

father James remained at Bolton until 5 January 1820. Obit of Harvey Woodworth in "Painesville Telegraph" 15 May 1884 says his father came to Unionville, Ashtabula Co., Ohio, in Jan. 1820. James is listed at Harpersfield, Ashtabula Co, in 1820. In the 1820 Census near the listing of James are the families of Ezekiel and Daniel Woodworth, probably James' brothers. James is listed again in the census for Harpersfield in 1830 and E. Woodworth is next to him. The family of James is given as: 2 males under 5; 3 males 20-30; 1 male 60-70 and 1 female 15-20; 1 female 20-30 and 1 female 50-60.

James moved to Painesville in April, 1839 to live with Harvey. James had a remarkable memory and was a fine mathematician. A surveyor by profession.

of Erdenheim, Penn. in 1986, has done much research on the Traver family connection and presents the following information. Nicholas died in 1807 and is buried in the Old Traver Cemetery near Tyre, Seneca Co., New York, where Caleb Woodworth and his wife Rebecca (Traver) are also buried. Notes on Nicholas in the DSGR Magazine 22:79, "Records from the Old Traver Cemetery, Seneca Co., New York" say he was born in Germany, died 1807 (lived in Vermont). A number of other Woodworths are buried in this cemetery, as are some of Nicholas' children.

From Thomas Rogers, Pilgrim, and Some of His Descendants by E. S. Daniels and J. E. Sawatelle, 1960, p. 131: "Asa Smith, born Sandisfield, Mass., 16 September 1758, died Tyre, N.Y., 25 October 1841. He married in Vergennes, Ver., 13 February 1788 Margaret Traver, born Stone Arabia, NY, 9 September 1765 and died Tyre 11 July 1840. Child, Nancy Smith born 24 January 1794, Bristol, Ver. (Asa and Margaret are buried in Traver Cemetery; she is called a daughter of Nicholas).

From Yesteryears 15:58, p. 70, Nicholas Traver is named as one of the early settlers of Tyre, around 1798 or shortly thereafter. However, this may have been the above Nicholas' son, also named Nicholas, who was born at Half Moon, Albany Co., N.Y., 31 October 1769 and died at Tyre 20 January 1834, buried in Traver Cemetery.

One other clue: from The Kelloggs in the Old World and the New by Timothy Hopkins, 1903, p. 118: David Kellogg...m. Christina Traver (whose ancestors came from Hanover, Germany), born Cambridge, N.Y., 18 May 1775 and died 30 May 1856. Seven children born Starksboro, Ver.

From land transactions, Nicholas is placed in Washington Co., N.Y., and Addison Co., Ver., as well as above locations where his children were born. There is no evidence that he came from Dutchess Co. He may have been one of a group of

Palatine Germans who settled in the Stone Arabia area - or one of the group that moved into Washington Co. about one or two generations after the emigrations in the early 1700's.

There is evidence that Gershom Evarts Woodworth was in Washington Co., in the 1790 Census. Res. Mayfield, Fulton Co.; Granville, Washington Co.; and Aurelius, Cayuga Co., N.Y. Settled at Aurelius in 1802. Lost an eye and arm in the Revolution. Served as Private and Sergeant, but no records available. In 1810 Census, Aurelius.

Kept the toll gate on the Pike at Aurelius Station. There has been considerable confusion concerning the children, but the listing below is believed the most probable:

He married Cambridge, Washington Co., New York, 14 February 1782 SARAH THOMPSON, born Colerbine, Mass., 16 November 1760 and died Mayfield 1 July 1833, daughter of Andrew and Margaret (Maxwell) Thompson.

"William volunteered at Cambridge, Washington Co., N.Y., in June, 1777. He then went to Albany, Fort Edward and Fort Ann. He was discharged briefly in August, 1777 to go from White Creek, Washington Co., N.Y., to Tyringham, Berkshire Co. with his father's family for the purpose of getting them out of the way of the enemy. He rejoined under the command of Colonel Van Wort and went from Salem, Hebron and East Town. On 21 March 1778 he was taken prisoner by Indians, one Tory and three Frenchmen. They took him to Coughnenaga, Canada and then to Montreal. He escaped in April and returned to Cambridge, N.Y., 18 May 1778. He was robbed of everything including a rifle for which he had paid \$30.00. It was very cold and he suffered "much." He went four days without food except for leeks and

anything he could catch in the woods. In May or June, he went out from Cambridge under Lieutenant Gershom Woodworth. He was discharged 9 October 1778. In 1781, he volunteered again and served as a scout on several missions. He applied and received a pension December 1833 stating he was a resident of Mayfield, Montgomery Co., N.Y. Jeremiah Wood and Collins O'Dell were listed as able to testify to his service" [Material from Marsha Hoffman Rising, a Woodworth Family genealogist].

Supplementing the above, William served in the Revolution in 16th Albany Company under Captain McPhillip and Wells, Colonels Van Woert and Williams, New York line and was in the Battle of Saratoga [Pension #17207].

From Ottawa, Ontario, 1 April 1955, this statement was received regarding Canadian Land Records: "William and Gershom are found in the index to the lower Canadian land records but not in the Upper Canada land records....appear on a list of associate settlers submitted by Moses Cowan, leader from Cambridge, New York, on 10 May 1792, praying for a grant of the Twp. of Stoke on the east side of the River St. Francis in the County of Richmond, Province of Quebec (formed from the former county of Buckinghamshire). Another shows the Woodworth family as former residents of the State of New York. Finally, a list of the grantees of the Twp. of Stokes shows that William Woodworth, Sr. received lots 13 in Range 1; 18 in Range 2; 20 and 21 in Range 4; and 22 in Range 5, total 12,000 acres. Gershom also listed with total of 1,000 acres."

In 1823 with wife, Lovina he sold two parcels of land, the last deed being witnessed by Rutson W. Woodworth.

He held a deed 13 August 1829 to a cemetery lot in Rochester, New York. In 1829 he purchased land in Brighton on East Avenue located near Rochester [Deeds Monroe Co. 2:391].

This land was seized on a judgment against him and another and was sold to a third party.

He was granted a patent for a fur cleaning process 19 April 1831; the latter patent expired due to his death and was extended in 1845 and re-assigned to son William W. Woodworth, as administrator of the estate of the deceased.

The Lathrop Genealogy states Polly, daughter of Lebbeus Lathrop of Northrop, born 3 January 1749 married Jasper Woodworth as his 2nd wife and they were not known to have had children.

Among papers deposited at the Conn. Historical Society there are notes that Jasper m. a KATHERINE WINTHROP and had 8 children of whom William, Katherine, Caleb, Clarissa and Cynthia are named.

Victor Montes, a family genealogist, writes in 1985 that "according to WAW there was one Jasper Woodworth in the Norwich, Conn., area. I think (VM) there were more than one as Jasper was married four times. One is a Polly Lathrop, then there was a Clara_____, and I found an Amanda Wright who married Jasper on 30 September 1809 at Columbia, Conn. [per VR of Columbia 1804-1852, pp. 20/21 at the Conn. State Library. Could this Jasper be a son or grandson of the Jasper who married Polly Lathrop?"

Connecticut Historical Collection, Vol. 2, p. 218, French and Indian War lists Jasper in Captain Stanton's Company from Groton in 1760.

The Connecticut Historical Bulletin April, 1949 shows he paid for 88 days of schooling for his children during the term beginning 13 December 1775. On 10 February 1776 he furnished cord wood for the school.

He married Preston 1st Church, 10 March 1791, ELIPHAL COOK of Preston, New London Co., Conn., born Norwich, Conn., 15 September 1752 and died 25 January 1842, daughter of Captain James Cook. At time of marriage Oliver was called "of Norwich."

He may be the Oliver who was Deacon in Greenville Church.

According to WAW, Oliver is not listed in Will of brother Caleb, and he appears nowhere as a son of Asa; however, in making his own Will, 8 October 1795, Tolland, Tolland Co., Conn., he mentions his wife Eliphal. On 25 November 1795, he made a codicil to the Will and mentions his eldest brother, Jasper.

He evidently had no children.

161. CHARLES 5 WOODWORTH, son of Asa 4 and Sarah (Isaac 3,2, Walter 1); born about 1757 (may be the Charles who was bp. 1st Church of Groton, New London Co., Conn., 12 January 1757). Died between 1825 and 1826, as his Will is dated 15 December 1825 and mentions his wife Joanna, daughter Polly Walker and sons Rhodolphus, Charles and Jedediah. The inventory was taken 25 March 1826.

He married 4 November 1779, JOANNA WOODWORTH, born 3 May 1749, daughter of Stephen (#21) and Allithear Woodworth. Estate of Joanna Woodworth was probated in 1827, when she is described as "of Stafford."

In 1790 Census, Charles is listed at Stafford with family of one male over 16, four under 16, and three daughters.

He was a soldier in the Revolution from Conn. in 1776. Resided Stafford, Tolland Co., Conn.

The Groton Avery Clan, p. 325 states "Charles Woodworth married Alithea, not Joanna."

He married SARAH [according to WAW] who joined the Franklin Church by profession 4 November 1821 and died Franklin 30 December 1841.

He may be the resident of New London Co. Census in 1790 with 2 males over 16, one under and 3 females.

He is probably the Reverend Amos Woodworth who resided in Windham Co., Conn. and was admitted a member of the Windham Co. Assoc. of Pastors on 18 May 1790, which included Franklin, Lisbon and Plainfield [Contributions to Eccl. History of Conn., p. 338].

2 July 1766 and died there 21 November 1801, daughter of Benjamin Lord. Simeon married (2) name unknown by whom he had son Chester. She died before 1812. He married (3) Mansfield 26 August 1813 PHOEBE TRACY who died there 1 July 1814. He married (4) Mansfield 1 January 1817 Widow BETHIA HINCKLEY of Lebanon, New London Co., Conn., born about 1781.

168. ABSALOM 5 WOODWORTH, son of Daniel 4 and Sarah (Daniel 3, Isaac 2, Walter 1); born Norwich, Connecticut, 13 August 1741, baptized, 18 October 1741 and died New York City. His estate mentions no family. Letters of Administration were granted on the estate, 12 November 1785, which named his

brother Robert.

He married CATHERINE SPRONG and had son Robert [First Settlers of Albany].

From History of the County of Albany, N.Y. from 1609 to 1886 by Howell & Tenny, 1886, p. 413: Records of the Committee of Safety & Correspondence [preserved in State Library]:

May 8, 1776: John Boyd confessed to selling Bohea tea for 7/6 per pound, contrary to resolution of the Continental Congress. That others did it, was his excuse. Resolved: That the said John Boyd has violated the Resolution, and ought to be considered as an enemy to the American cause, and it is recommended that all persons break off all intercourse with said Boyd. Absalom Woodworth was also convicted of the same offense and punished in the same manner (apparently "profiteering").

He married 1766 RACHEL FITCH, born Salisbury, Conn., 7 July 1736 and died there, 1815 [DAR #85543], daughter of James and Abial (Metcalf) Fitch and a descendant of Gov. William Bradford. Moved from Lebanon to Salisbury. Her father Captain James Fitch (Captain in Revolutionary War) d. 15 November 1760 and his widow moved to Greenbush, New York [N.Y. Rec. 1933, p. 35].

Robert moved to Rensselaer Manor, now Greenbush, New York, before 1769, but does not appear on the 1790 Census there.

Robert was appointed Captain of Albany Company of Militia in 1778. Was State Senator 1792/4 and

Judge in Court of Common Pleas.

He married Bozrah, Conn., 26 January 1775 SYBIL FOX. Aside from his father, he appears to be the only Benjamin in the vicinity at this time.

On 10 May 1780 [Norwich Deeds 26:203] Benjamin and wife Sybil of Norwich conveyed to her father, William Fox of Norwich, land received through her mother Hannah Fox, through Hannah's father Ebenezer Lyon. Nothing further is known about this couple.

171. DARIUS 5 WOODWORTH, son of Benjamin 4 (Daniel 3, Isaac 2, Walter 1); born perhaps Norwich, Conn., 4 January 1755 [Pension Claim].

In 1790 resided in New London Co., Conn., with family 1-1-2. He served in the Conn. line in 1777/8 from Norwich and received a bounty.

He settled in Georgia, Camden Co., New York.

From Deed Book I, Vol. 3, p. 193 - I/40: George S. Woodworth to Darius Woodworth, deed dated 6 October 1812, conveying grantor's moiety or half of Lot in Jefferson, Camden Co., deeded them by Timothy Hopkins, 10 April 1810, Grantor's wife Catherine waives dower right. Also: Vol. 3, p.

200, Deed Book I: I/299: George S. Woodworth to Darius Woodworth, both of Camden Co. Deed dated 15 Feb. 1814, for Town Lot 6 in Jefferson. Grantor's wife Catherine waives dower.

From the Georgia Genealogical Magazine Vol. 1, p. 84, - 6 Nov. 1815, Darius Woodworth appointed administrator of Daniel Mann. Elizabeth, daughter of Samuel [#128] Woodworth married a Daniel Mann. Could they be the same?

172. ROGER 5 WOODWORTH, son of Benjamin 4 (Daniel 3, Isaac 2, Walter 1); born perhaps Norwich, Conn., about 1756 and died Fletcher, Vermont, 21 October 1834 [Ver. VR].

The only reference to Roger's wife is when son John was born and she was called "LYDIA" (perhaps DOWNER). Son John is the only known recorded birth to Roger.

Roger served in the Conn. line, enlisting in Lebanon, Conn., in 1777 for 3 years and received pension at Fletcher, Vermont from 1818 to 1834 [Pension #41373].

Mrs. Josephine Short, a great great granddaughter of Roger stated she had a record from Washington, D.C., indicating that Roger and his brother Roswell and their father Benjamin were in the same company in the Revolution.

Another family member stated that Harmony Woodworth was a daughter of Roger and not of Roswell as given in the Wells, Vermont, history. They also stated that Harmony had a sister Betsey who married a brother of Joshua Hulet.

Roger joined Columbia Church in 1782, same year as Timothy Woodworth.

In 1790, Roger was at Hartford, Windsor Co., Vermont, with one male over 16; two males under 16 and four females including wife.

In 1800 he was at Windsor, Windsor Co., Vermont,

and in 1810 he was at Fletcher, Franklin Co., Vermont. In 1820 his name was given as "Woolworth." In 1830 he was still at Fletcher.

There was a Roger Woodworth of Nantucket, Mass., who married at Fletcher 28 September 1827 CORNELIA A. THOMPSON of Brattleboro, Vermont. This perhaps could have been a son of this Roger.

173. ROSWELL 5 WOODWORTH, son of Benjamin 4 ((Daniel 3, Isaac 3, Walter 1); born perhaps Norwich, Conn., about 1758 and died Wells, Rutland Co., Vermont, 16 January 1812, buried Wells Town Cemetery.

He married Wells 5 October 1784 PHEBE PARKER [Ver. VR]. However, Lyme, N.H., records show he married (2) there 5 October 1784 PHEBE PARKER born 1764 and died 1852. The History of Wells, Vermont and Francis: Descendants of Robert Francis of Wethersfield, Conn., compiled by Charles E. Francis, 1906, p. 149, 150 states Roswell married Lucinda Auranda Francis, daughter of Nathan and Abigail (Thompson) Francis of Wallingford, Conn.

According to Ver. VR, Roswell could not have married Lucinda Auranda Francis as she was born after 1780. Also it states Roswell went West around 1816. This evidently is in error since Roswell died at Wells in 1812; however, his son Roswell Jr. went to Arkansas.

In 1790 Census Roswell was at Wells with family 1-2-3 and in 1800 was also there with family 3-2-0-0-1 and 3-2-1-1-0.

Records show Roswell was a soldier from Wells or Pawlet in 1776, and his widow Phebe drew a pension [#18369].

175. JOSEPH 5 WOODWORTH (twin), son of Benjamin 4 (Daniel 3, Isaac 2. Walter 1); born perhaps Norwich, Conn. 24 April 1763; bp. Bozrah 8 May 1763. He died East Montpelier, Vermont, in 1817; buried Green Mountain Cemetery there. His Will was probated 28 April 1817 and mentions wife Elizabeth, sons Lyman and John and daughters Polly, Experience and Nancy.

He married ELIZABETH.

In 1800 Census Joseph is listed at Montpelier with 1 male under 10, 2 from 10-16 and 1 over 26 but less than 45. However, he may have been in this locality as early as 1790 with his brother Ziba, as in 1790 Census Ziba is listed with 2 males over 16 in family and these may have been himself and Joseph. Joseph's family may have followed later from Conn.

He was town representative at Montpelier in 1803 and 1810 and Selectman in 1795, 1805, and 1814 [Hemenway 4:272]. He evidently was in Colonel Latimer's Regiment, Captain Skinner's Co., drafted 25 August and discharged 8 November 1777. Was at Saratoga in General Poor's Continental Brigade, Arnold's Division in battles 19 September and 9 October 1777.

Some sources list a son Joseph, born 1784-1790, Onion River, Vermont (later known as Winooski River), but this is in some question as he was not listed in Will. However could have died before that time.

176. ZIBA 5 WOODWORTH (twin), son of Benjamin 4 (Daniel 3, Isaac 2, Walter 1); born perhaps Norwich, [Bozrah according to Montpelier VR] Conn., 24 April 1763; bp. Bozrah Church 8 May 1763 and died Montpelier, Vermont, 27 November 1826 [Ver. VR and Pension Rec.].

He perhaps married (1) Bozrah 6 December 1786 LUCRETIA OSGOOD. She became ill and died on the eve of his final departure for Vermont. He married (2) LUCY PALMER, born about 1766 (from Canaan, New Hampshire) and died Montpelier 1842 [VR Montpelier], buried Maplewood Cemetery.

He served in Conn. during the Revolution and was wounded in the thigh at the Battle of Groton Heights 6 September 1781 [Allyn, pp. 219, 269, 270, 289]. According to the story, he was thrown into a cart among the dead and being conscious he prayed for strength to make some sign. He made a vow that if God would spare his life he would devote it to His service. With that he groaned aloud, was heard and taken to a hospital.

He bought lands in Vermont. Listed as farmer, Baptist clergyman [VR Montpelier]. He was one of the 27 founders of the Town of Montpelier. He attended the first town meeting in 1791 and was elected first Town Clerk. In History of Montpelier, Vermont by Thompson, Ziba is stated to have been a nephew of Colonel Ledyard. In 1806, Ziba was ordained in the Baptist Church.

He married HANNAH (perhaps MORE) as they named a daughter Hannah More and his son Joseph named a daughter by that name also. Hartford Library Barbour Collection lists an "Ansel who married 20 November 1828 Caroline Way.

In 1790 he was evidently in New London Co., Conn. with family 1-0-3 name given as "Ansel."

He fought in the Revoltuion in Captain William Latham's Regiment and was severely wounded in the Battle of Groton Heights. He was shot in the neck by a musket ball which entered under the right ear and exited near the spine, severing the tendon and causing his head to rest on his right shoulder. He was in pain the remainder of his life and unable to work steadily. In his words the wound caused "a train of nervous spasmodic afflictions which rendered me almost unable to perform manual labor and at times partially deranged in my mentals, that at present I was a wandering person dependent in part on the bounty of my country and in part on the charity of my friends." In 1796 he was awarded a pension 4 September 1794 in the sum of \$45 per year.

He appears to have spent some time in Montpelier, Vermont with brothers Ziba and Joseph after 1781.

Two sources state he had a son Samuel and a daughter Phoebe but records are only found for a son Joseph and a daughter Hannah.

He married Bozrah, Conn., 12 June 1790 ABIGAIL GARDINER/GARDNER, born 12 April 1767 and died Bridgewater 5 July 1845.

Samuel was a member of the New York Assembly in 1825.

was a square mansion of brick, two stories high, with a hall in the center. In 1819 he built the Bank of Michigan, a one-story office about 30' square.

Benjamin evidently kept the old Steamboat Hotel, ran a ferry to Windsor, carried on a grist mill at Rochester and ran the only line of stages in Michigan between Detroit and Mount Clemens; the route being on the river bank and across the Grand Marais.

Benjamin served in Captain Sibley's Regiment in the War of 1812. Was a Captain of an artillery company.

He lost a large amount of his property by fire and removed to St. Clair, upstream from Detroit, to live with his only surviving daughter. He was unfortunate with his family as eight of the twelve children died young.

For the remainder of the diary no further mention is made of Sam's wife. In addition to the main farm, Sam owned several lots of land in the western end of the Island, one of which was sold in March, 1885 for the sum of 40 dollars to Asa W. Davison" [Eagles, p. 43].

In his Will of 1882, Samuel left the use of the house to wife Mary Ann, and divided the lands equally between his sister, Sarah Davison, nephew Elihu Woodworth, John A. Woodworth and Harriett A. Woodworth. These lands were subsequently sold in 1883 by the executors of the estate to \$1,810 to Joseph K. Allen. It is assumed they had no children as none were mentioned in Will.

"An account book of H. C. Woodworth retained in the family of Mary Woodworth Huber provides the only facts he recorded on which to base a narrative of his movements. Beginning entries in 1837 records the accounts of the customers of Heman Woodworth, keeper of a general store in Licking Co., Ohio. The entries show purchases of food, country store items of clothing, and everyday items of household use: coal, oil, axe, saw, etc. and the periodic payments against those accounts. The last entries of this sort (which seem to indicate final settlement in most instances) were in 1851.

The cover of the book bears the identification of ownership and a partially identifiable location as Libery Township, Licking Co. Inside is an entry which identifies Heman Woodworth as constable of Plain Township without a date or further elaboration. Still another entry as follows: 'Know all men by these presents that I, H. C. Woodworth of Franklin Co., Plain Township for and in consideration of the sum of eight dollars to me in hand paid.' Other entries refer to 'the great flood in Granville July 1st, 1834; the hail storm in Utica, Ohio, on May 26th 1839 as well as the election of Wilson Shannon as Governor in 1838" [from Retired Brig. Gen. Hal Cushman Pattison in 1985].

This account book also contains a record of family births and deaths upon which this family record is based.

Heman may have been the "H. C. Woodworth" who in 1843 was an original member of the Universalist Church at Liberty, Licking Co., Ohio.

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Benjamin Woodward appeared before the Court and gave oath that the above-written is a true inventory of his late father, Walter Woodworth, deceased, so far as he knows, and when more comes to his knowledge, he is to bring it to this inventory by virtue of the oath in Court, March 2d, 1685/6.

Barbara Cruchon from Seattle, Wash., has done outstanding research on the earlier Woodworth generations. Some of her material is incorporated in the body of the book and some of it used in the Addendum. She has supplied invaluable information for future generations.

2. THOMAS 2 WOODWORTH:

The first record we find of Thomas Woodworth is dated 1 June 1664, when Gowin White of Scituate sold to John Otis and Thomas Woodward, both of Scituate, "a certaine tract of upland and meddow land...in Scituate aforsaid. [which] was given by the Freeman of Scittuate aforsaid unto William Gilson deceased....," containing about 60 acres, "bounded on the south side with the river beginning att a great rocke...." The tract apparently lay to the west of Brushy Hill, as nearly as can be determined from the description in the deed. William Gilson was uncle to John Damon, Deborah's father, and had brought him to New England as a young lad.

Perhaps it was on this land that Thomas lived and kept his trader's shop, said to have been located about a quarter mile south of Stockbridge's Mill.

The next year, 1665, the Town named Thomas Wood-

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worth to bait and tend the two wolf traps required of every town by Plymouth Court. He was paid 10 shillings per year, as well as a fee for the wolves killed.

In 1673, he and eleven other Scituate men (including his brother Joseph and Charles Stockbridge) were complained of before Plymouth Court by Isaac Chittenden for assembling together on May 14th last and breaking down a "great parcel of fence" Chittenden had put up to mark the boundaries of his land. "The said persons being summoned to appear att this Court to answare the said [complaint], and their defence being fully heard, it appeared evidently to the Court that their said acte was done in a roietus way in regard of their number, yett conceiving that their intent was to comit a trespass only..doe therefore onely amerce them to pay a five shillings apeece to the use of the collonie."

In this same year (1673) however, he was described as an "allowed and approved inhabitant" by a joint committee of the Court and town, and was assigned a portion of the common lands.

When in May 1676 Scituate was attacked by the Indians during King Philip's War, the few able-bodied men remaining in the town were able to hold the stockade at Stockbridge's Mill. The Indians burned houses, killed cattle and destroyed the newly-planted fields before they were repulsed. Thomas Woodworth's home was one of those destroyed; he may have been away with the troops that day. His loss was 40 lbs.

In November of 1676, Deborah (Damon) Woodworth received a portion of the estate of her unmarried brother John Damon Jr., who may have been killed in King Philip's War. She also, in 1696, received part of the estate of another unmarried brother, Daniel Damon.

According to church records, "Deborah Woodworth, wife of Thomas Woodworth joyn'd" the First Church

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of Scituate on 3 June 1711.

By the Will of his father, who died in 1686, Thomas received acreage of both upland and marshland in Scituate, as well as one-third of his father's land at Seconet (Little Compton), and one-half of the land still to be purchased there. It is said that this land on Swamp Road in Little Compton was held by his family for many years, and was located "next to the Southworth place." Two of Thomas' children, Hezekiah and Catherine, settled in Little Compton.

In 1690 Thomas Woodworth was appointed Clerk of the Market, which office he held until 1711. In 1712, he was made Scaler of Weights and Measures, perhaps another name for the same office.

Thomas made his will 13 Feb. 1718/19, and it was proved in court 17 March following. In it he named his wife Deborah, son Hezekiah's children (Hezekiah had died over a year before), sons John and Ebenezer, and daughters Deborah Pincen, Catherine Davenport, Hannah Jackson, Jerusha Randall and Mary Vinal. Thomas had lived to a good ripe age, being around 78 years at his death.

Some histories claim Thomas bought lands in Little Compton in 1674 (should this be 1694?), but his name does not appear on a list of first settlers in Little Compton on that date. (The list does include his brothers Benjamin, Joseph and Isaac. Since Isaac would only have been about 14 years old at the time, this published list appears to be imperfect.)

Deane's History of Scituate quotes a town vote in Jan. 1680, to build a meetinghouse at the piece of land where Thomas Woodworth's house stood, near the junction of the several roads a few rods south of Stockbridge's Mill. It appears, however, that the two new meetinghouses built around this time, for both the First and Second Societies were located upon the sites of their original churches, and none was built south of Stockbridge's Mill.

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3. JOSEPH 2 WOODWORTH:

This second son of Walter Woodworth lived all his life in the town of Scituate. Records describe him as a shop-keeper there.

On 23 March 1672, he and Anthony Dodson witnessed a pre-nuptial agreement between William Tubbs Sr. and Dorothy Soane, widow of William Soane (who was half-brother of Joseph's wife Sarah).

Joseph was summoned to appear before Plymouth Court in July of 1673, when Isaac Chittenden complained that 12 men, Joseph and his brother Thomas among them, "assembled together of the 14th day of May last, and did, contrary to law and in a roietus way, throw down a fence or great parcel of fence of the abovesaid Chettendens, by him sett up on land layed out to him by such as were by the authoritie of this govment thereunto impowered." The court listened to their story, and determined that no harm was meant, "theire intent was to comit a trespas onely," and fined each five shillings.

In March 1676 he appeared in Court again, this time on behalf of his sister Elizabeth, who had had a child out of wedlock the year before, fathered by Robert Stetson Jr. Joseph posted 20 pounds to assure her appearance at the next court in June. The Court set a maintenance schedule for the child, and by July it was agreed between Joseph, representing his sister, and Cornet Robert Stetson, on behalf of his son Robert, that the Court's verdict was just.

Joseph is said to have purchased lands in Seconet, and is included on a list of first proprietors of Little Compton dated 1674.

He served on several juries, among them a jury convened in March 1677 to look into the death of "one Robinson" who was killed when a tree fell on him. Joseph's brother Benjamin served on this jury also.

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He father died in 1686, and bequeathed him upland and marshland in Scituate, 25 acres at Seconet (Little Compton), one-half of the yet-unpurchased lands at Seconet and 10 pounds.

Joseph's name is included on a list of freeman dated 1689, in the Plymouth records.

According to the will of Sarah's father, John Stockbridge, who died in Boston 1657, she was to receive 10 pounds" when 21 or at her marriage." By a deed of 21 Jan. 1688/9 the "Children and Successors" of John Stockbridge divided his estate at Scituate, among them Joseph and Sarah Woodworth. This deed was sworn to in July 1693, and finally acknowledged in March 1707 by the heirs, including Joseph and Sarah.

Joseph and Sarah, his wife, are listed in 1707 by Rev. Nathaniel Pitcher, as members of the First (North) Church of Scituate.

He made his Will 3 Dec. 1712, and it was allowed 13 June 1718. His beloved wife Sarah was given use of the easterly end of his dwelling house, and five pounds yearly. Oldest son Joseph received the estate at Little Compton, where he was then living, and the other son, Benjamin, received the estate in Scituate. The five daughters Margaret, Sarah, Elizabeth, Abigail and Ruth, each received 50 pounds and division of the household goods. Son Benjamin was executor.

The inventory of his estate included Joseph's purse, apparel and books. There were two feather beds, a flock bed, two table, six chairs and three chests. Kitchen-ware included two brass kettles, a brass skillet, pewter dishes and earthenware, and an iron pot. There was a quantity of tubs, barrels and hogsheads, as well as two spinning wheels, cards, sheep wool, hatchel, a loom, and a warming pan. Livestock consisted of two oxen, two cows and other cattle, horses, sheep, and pigs, and there were "Husbandry tools of all sorts."

Joseph was about 73 years old at his death.

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5. ISAAC 2 WOODWORTH:

We first hear of Isaac when, in July 1679, he is fined one pound by Plymouth Court "for playing att cards 2 severall times."

He was a carpenter, and was included as a debtor in settlement of the estate of Richard Dwelley of Scituate in 1692, perhaps for carpenter work.

His father, in his will written 26 Nov. 1685, left Isaac one-third of the lands at Seconet (Little Compton). He probably moved there with his young family around 1692, where they lived for a least five years, perhaps longer. Isaac is reported to have purchased land in Norwich, Conn., about 1697, but apparently did not settle there until after 28 April 1701, when a Plymouth Colony deed regarding sale of some land belonging to his late father-in-law, calls him "Isaac Woodward of Little Compton."

He was admitted freeman at Norwich in 1705, and built the second meeting-house there. A deed is recorded in 1707 at Lebanon, Conn., from Benjamin Woodworth to his "brother Isaac."

Isaac's Will, dated 5 Jan. 1713/14, proved 13 April 1714, mentions his wife Lydia and nine children, who are not named. His son Moses was executor.

In some sources, the mother of Isaac's wife, Lydia Standlake, is given as "Lydie (-----) Brestow." Richard Standlake's second wife was Lydia (-----) Barstow, widow of Jeremiah Barstow, who was killed in King Philip's War in 1676. (She had a son, also Jeremiah Barstow, who was taken into captivity shortly after). Lydia had apparently married Richard Standlake by 1677, according to the Barstow estate records, and of course could not be mother of Richard's daughter Lydia, who was b. in 1664.

United Congregational Church records, Little

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Compton (as reported in Arnold's Vital Records of RI), show David and Isaac, sons "of Isaac." as both admitted and baptized 3 Nov. 1704. This seems to be a misreading or miscopying of the record.

From the Records of Chancery Court, New York Guardianship 1691-1815 compiled by Kenneth Scott; Holland Society of New York 1971, p. 107: Bill of Complaint (filed 20 Dec. 1798) of Daniel, Cornelius, and Robert Woodworth, infant children

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of Absalom Woodworth, by Robert Woodworth, their uncle and next friend, vs. Philip Van Rensselaer, of Albany, Philip Van Rensselaer has died and the children wish to carry on the suit against his widow, Mary Van Rensselaer [BM2329-W].

175. JOSEPH 5 WOODWORTH (twin), son of Benjamin 4 (Daniel 3, Isaac 2, Walter 1); born Norwich, New London Co., Conn., 24 April 1763.

Will was probated 28 April 1817 and in it he left his wife Elizabeth, the household furniture and the orchard. After her death it was to go to his son Lyman who received the buildings on the farm. He left his daughter, Polly, twelve acres of land, one old bed, one cow and five sheep and "living in my house and the orchard for her common use." His daughter Experience and Nancy each received ten acres, a cow and some sheep, and son, John twenty-five acres.

In December 1794, Joseph bought the western half of Lot 11, first division, of Jacob Davis and 25 acres in Lot 6, paying him 50 pounds. In 1795, he purchased 42 more acres of Allen Carpenter in Lot 12, the south corner to a stake by the side of the road leading from the Phinehas Stoddard estate. Joseph's home was the present Thomas Keck place on the Lyle Young Road [Revolutionary War Soldiers of East Montpelier, p. 91, 92].

352. WILLIAM 6 WOODWORTH, son of Gershom 5 and Jane (Gershom 4, Caleb 3, Benjamin 2, Walter 1). The following is from NEHGS, October 1986 issue of the Register, pp. 291-311, "The Daniel Shays Family" and concerns Daniel Shays' daughter Susan, who is supposed to have married William [#352] Woodworth:

"Daniel Shays was born about 1747 in the vicinity of Hopkinton, Mass., and died at Sparta, Livingston Co., N.Y., 25 or 29 Sept. 1825, age 78 years. He was buried in an unmarked grave north

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of Scottsburg, Livingston Co., N.Y. He was married twice: (1) to Abigail Gilbert and (2) at Sparta, 1 April 1815, to widow Rhoda (Coller) Havens. One of his six known children was daughter Susan (Suky), who married before 1824, Jonathan Weston, a migratory school teacher. She was married before Daniel made his will 23 Jan. 1824 (never probated and on file in the Livingston Co. Courthouse), in which she (as Suky Weston) was made executrix and sole heir. Susan was living in late 1825, but no more is known. A Jonathan Weston was living in Otsego Co., N.Y., in 1830 and 1840. They had one known child, Jonathan (Jr.), b. 1812, living at Middlefield, Otsego Co., N.Y., 1850 Census."

William Woodworth is not mentioned, so it would be logical to deduct that Susan Shay was never married to him. (GAR)

There is a William Woodworth showing up in the Quebec area and then removing to New Germany, Nova Scotia, who is the progenitor of a large Canadian following. The possibility exists that these Williams may be one in the same. Further research should be done. (JWB)
