of the City of the 25th day of December in the year One thousand nine
hundred and fifty seven English St. by the Justice of the Peace for
Bellingham the daughter and executrix named in his said will wherein
was named Bellingham as their being first given by Percy Johnson
to administer

six hundred and fifteen years. Willmason Willmason son of Willmason and
Willmason my self being well in body but failing in mind do make
my last will and my testament in this manner
praised be god. I do make this my last will and my testament in this manner
and same shall remaining. First I bequeath my soul to god the father
of a faithfull creature, and my body to be buried in the church
of St. Peters Brewood, Cheshire. I do make this will in the presence
sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament my wife unto whom all
that I have, or namely six poundes being in the summe of my dead body
of this County, and forsooth I bound that John Hetherington of Wotton both
and County shillinge which I borred of the said Cawys both in
my hands. Item shillinge that Willmason borred of the said both
Item twenty shillinge that my brother Francis Jackson did owe me. Item
Twenty shillinge that James Watson had of the said both Cawys for
shillinge six pence. Item one pound that James Watson had of the said both
wch of my goodly mattole and immortelle. And my will and wch desire
is that my brother Robert Jackson and my brother Francis
Hetherington be Executors and Curaus to my will, and let them see to
the execucyon of me and for the yeare, and if it do please god that my life
doe beginn to turne to that day then my will is that John Hetherington
Eats affter his decess for my God child, and then ore Ralph Talbot
and equally divided betwixt my brother Edward Willmason and my
brother Willmason and the other two to be equally divided
betwixt my brother Robert Jackson and Francis Jackson and Thomas
Jackson and James Watson and Thomas Pott. In to that my last
will and Testament. I do full to my hand am stali this writing
day of May One thousand six hundred and fifteen years sealed. Signed and
delivere in the presence of Robert Jackson his mark. Willmason
Willmason John Hetherington. Item my will and desire is
that my sonnes be sent to the schollies to learn to read and write
untill he be full to put to a trade.

17 goods be valued it is my will and minde that ſhe ſhall haue them made
18 upp either in loue-hold goods or money to the ſume of Twenty ſounds, ne
19 whether ſhe pleſe, and if ſo be that ſhe take it in money it is my will and
20 minde that ſhe ſhall not eat it ſpare within ſix moneths after my deafe
21 Item it is my will and minde that my ſonne Stephen Woodworth ſhall pay
22 to Elen naturall mother the ſume of Elen ſounds out of Elen ownne proprie-
23 ty as a Legacie after my deafe. Item I give and bequeath to my ſonne
24 in lawe John Brown of Rothwell Ten ſounds, which my ſonne Thomas
25 Batteſhy gaue to me as a Legacie at his deafe. Item I give and bequeath
which 26 to fifti Children I am Grandfather to every one of them three ſhillings four
27 pence to be ſped at twelve monthly end after my deafe, to as many as there
28 are at living. Item I give to my ſonne Stephen Woodworth all my hufbandy
29 geare and all other laufe wood and timber about my house; Item I give to
30 my daughter Alice Hamerton one ſpayre of bedstoys now ſtanding in
31 thiſ lower laſt. Item I give and bequeath to my ſonne Stephen Woodworth
32 fifti ſounds of bedstoys, one Gabbord and two of my bed Ordry two dishboards
33 all my tables formeþ laufe bordys, chairys and Stooles and one Iron
34 Chimny, Kichen crockes one baxton and brige and one ſhelf. Item it is
35 my will and minde that my debtys and funerall charges be kept the paid
36 out of the residue of my goods by my Executors Exeutors named. Item I
37 give and bequeath as a gift or Legacie to my daughter Alice Hamerton
38 thiſ ſome of thirtene pounds ſix ſhillings eight pence to be ſped unto
39 Elen at three years end after my deafe, if ſhe be then living, and if
40 not to goe to Elen ſhilleian. Item I nominate and apponite; Item
41 Woodworth my wif, and Stephen Woodworth my ſonne sole Executor
42 of thiſ my laſt will and tiffament; Item I nominate and apponite
43 John Howorth and William Sheppard Superbiforſ of thiſ my laſt
44 will and tiffament putting eſch trust and confidencie in them, that
