of wills on the nyneteenth day of February in the year One thousand six  
hundred fifty seven English. By the oath of John and Jane  
Williamson the daughter and executrix named in the said will. Whom  
was committed Domareon for they being first sworn by Comission truly  
to administer

I William Williamson of the County of Middlesex in the  
Kingdom of Great Brittain being sick in body but sound in mind  
do hereby make this my last will and testament in witness  
whereof I have subscribed my name and seal in the presence  
of a lawful executor and my wife to be licensed in the County of  
Middlesex. To wit: I do hereby make my will as followeth  
I do hereby give and bequeath unto you all  
that I have or shall have in the County of Middlesex  
of that County and four pound that John Hothergall of  
that County shilling which Thomas Lamb of that County hath  
in his hands. Item four shilling that William Lamb of that  
County twenty shilling that my brother James Jackson  
of that County twenty shilling that Jane Watson  
of that County six pence. Item one penny that Jane  
Watson hath with all the rest of my goods movable  
and immovable. And my will and desire is that my  
brother Robert Jackson and my wife friend John  
Hothergall be tutors and overseers for my child  
whilst he shall be under the age of one and twenty  
years. And if it do please God that my child  
die before it come to that age then my will is that  
my child be equally divided betwixt my brother  
Edward Williamson and my brother William  
Ameynto and the other share to be equally divided  
betwixt my brother Robert Jackson and James  
Jackson and James Watson and Thomas Pether. And  
to that my last will and testament I do set to my hand  
and seal this twentieth day of May One thousand  
six hundred fifty seven. In witness whereof I have  
subscribed my name and seal in the presence of  
William Williamson John Hothergall Executors. Item  
my will and desire is that my sonne be sent  
to the school for to learne to read and write  
until he be full to put to a trade

 17 goods be valued it is my will and minde that she shall have them made  
 18 up either in Laneschole goods or money to the some of Twenty pound, or  
 19 whether she please, and if soe be that she take it in money it is my will and  
 20 minde that she shall not have it paid within six months after my decease  
 21 Item it is my will and minde that my sonne Stephen Woodworth shall pay  
 22 to his naturall mother the some of Ten pound out of his owne proper  
 23 goods as a Legacy after my decease; Item I give and bequeath to my sonne  
 24 in Lawe John Burrowe of Rothwell three pound which my sonne Thomas  
 25 Bateley gave to me as a Legacy at his decease; Item I give and bequeath  
 26 to five children Jam Grandfather to every one of them three shillinge for  
 27 ever to be paid at twelve monthly end after my decease, to as many of them  
 28 as is living; Item I give to my sonne Stephen Woodworth all my husbandry  
 29 gear and all other Lasse wood and timber about my house; Item I give to  
 30 my daughter Alice Flammiton one spawre of bedstee now standing in  
 31 the lower last; Item I give and bequeath to my sonne Stephen Woodworth  
 32 five spawre of bedstee, one Cullbord and two of my best Cheky two dish boards  
 33 all my Dabbs former Lasse boards, Charco and Stools, and one Iron  
 34 Chimney, Kirkin, one baxtone and buy's and one chest; Item it is  
 35 my will and minde that my debt and funtall charges be honestly paid  
 36 out of the residue of my goods by my Executors & Executors named; Item I  
 37 give and bequeath as a gift or Legacy to my daughter Alice Flammiton  
 38 the some of thirtene pound, six shillinge eight pence to be paid unto  
 39 her at three yeares end after my decease, if she be then living, and if  
 40 not to goe to her children; Item I nominate and appointe; Ann  
 41 Woodworth my wife and Stephen Woodworth my sonne, sole Executors  
 42 of this my last will and testament; Item I nominate and appointe  
 43 John Howorth and William Sheppard Supervisors of this my last  
 44 will and Testament putting such trust and confidence in them, that  
 45 they will be my minde fullfiller; Witnesses hereof; John Howorth
